VICAR'S REPORT– Bill Fulton

Stewardship

We'll have some more thank you letters to send as more pledge cards have come in. We still have some work to do in contacting those who haven't returned their pledge cards yet.

Receiving Treasurer

My thanks to Pam Morton for the excellent job she has done in tracking our pledges using the QuickBooks program. As we begin a new year, Pam will begin using the Servant Keeper software we purchased last year.

Building permits getting close

Soil remediation at the new site is complete, and our architects have re-submitted our permit applications. The County should give us an answer by early February. We need to schedule a meeting with New Fellowship Church to make plans for using the current church for the latter part of 2017.

Architect and Design Committee

I am happy to report that work to accomplish remediation of the soil at the new property has been completed by Resolve Engineering and Geotech. St. Antony's has received the report from the testing lab (see attached) indication that the soil tests are now below the Environmental Agency requirements.

MAP Ltd. completed the changes requested by Kitsap County and provided the documents to Rice Fergus Miller-(RFM) architects for resubmission to Kitsap County DCD. The resubmittal was made January 4, 2017. It is expected that the county should complete the review and provide site development permit by the end of January 2017.

Capital Campaign Committee

The generous people of St. Antonys continue their pledges toward the new church building. At this time approximately 75% of the \$462,227.00 pledged money is in hand. What a great feeling to know the support by our members.

Sales Committee

The barn at the new property has a leaking roof. At a previous BC meeting it was authorized to purchase new temporary covering for the barn. David Sorrell did purchase the tarps (heavy vinyl sheets with nylon cord reinforcement) and they have been put in place. The barn is now covered and will protect the timber stored inside.

Transition Committee

Work has begun to update information previously gathered for possible transition from the current location to a potential interim location. Due to the slippage of the construction time frame New Fellowship leaders are being contacted to see if arrangements can be made to remain at our current location until the new church is ready for occupancy.
