#### **Vicar's Report – Bill Fulton**

##### **Bill Thaete will be our new deacon**

Our deacon intern, Bill Thaete, will be ordained as a vocational deacon at Diocesan Convention on October 28, and he has been assigned by Bishop Rickel to serve at St. Antony's as our deacon. I think it would be nice if we could give Bill an ordination gift when he serves as deacon for us the first time, probably November 5, All Saints' Sunday.

##### **Concrete has been poured!**

The contractor poured the concrete footings for our new building this week, after resolving a frustrating delay caused by another permit required by the County.

##### **Godly Play**

I'm very pleased to report that the Godly Play program is off to a great start with our children. Mary Zabinski has been leading this effort, with Kathy Little, Emily Nickerson, and Allison Carlson partnering with her. We'll need to continue to support this program financially so we can gather the materials we need.

##### **Memorial Committee**

Charles Smith and Gail Ferguson have been working with me to create a timeline for our application process and to form a basic outline for the application. We could use more people to help us on this committee.

##### **Stewardship campaign**

It's time for us to pay attention to our pledge drive for 2018. We need to decide what kind of pledge drive we want to have and set a timeline for it.

##### **Counters/Receiving Treasurer**

Pam Morton, our receiving treasurer, has been working diligently to switch over to the Servant Keeper program. The June and September quarterly reports have come from Servant Keeper. We need to network the two computers in the office so the counters can enter their data directly into Servant Keeper.

##### **Thanks to Dick Scott**

My thanks to Fr. Scott for celebrating the Eucharist in my place on Sunday, September 25.

We're very fortunate that Fr. Scott considers this a part of his ministry at St. Antony's and does not charge the customary fee of \$280 for supply clergy.

### **New Facilities - John Stockwell**

October 11, 2017

The committee met as scheduled Thursday evening October 5th at 7:00.

I am happy to report that the issue with footing inspection has been resolved. I was on site Tuesday October 10th to observe concrete being poured into the footing forms. Stem wall pour is scheduled for Thursday the 12th. Now significant progress can be observed in the near future. Due to the county causing construction delays the project is approximately 6 weeks off schedule. In conversation with our contractor he will be working to make up that time now that concrete is in place. Work on the parking area continues and the septic system also. A change to the style of septic tank from fiberglass to concrete was required due to depth of burial and soil cover over tank. The engineering firm for the project, Krazan has been conducting the required testing and supplying results to the contractor with copies to me.

Discussion regarding upgrade and use of the barn at the new property brought many ideas forward. Any major activity with the barn will follow the work on the church building. Much of the proposed work on the barn can be completed in-house and with volunteer work.
