

## *Vicar's Voice*

I've found it quite enlightening to be part of the design process for our new church building. Our design committee has been meeting with our architects from Rice Fergus Miller to iron out all the details of a new building.

Like a married couple trying to design a new house, we're trying to satisfy all the requirements for ministry in our new building while staying under our ceiling cost. It's quite a challenge, and I think we're making good progress.

Our architects have met with us upwards of fifteen meetings as we've discussed all our requirements. They're good listeners, and they've responded well as we've wrestled with our needs. The design has evolved as we've worked together, and it's slowly taking shape.

Some of the parameters we've come up with:

Look like a church from Old Frontier Road

Be able to seat about 175 for special services

Have room for a cry room, nursery and Sunday School

Have a Pacific Northwest feel

Adequate room for members of the flower guild and altar guild in the new sacristy

A good working kitchen with the ability to serve a large dinner

A welcoming entrance and narthex

A functional space for coffee hour

A multi-use gathering room for meetings, library, choir practice, and/or Sunday School

Adequate offices and administrative space that can be easily found

Storage space

A courtyard that serves as an "outdoor room"

A worship space that feels like sacred space

Some kind of vertical element like a bell tower that points upward to God

All of this has to take place in a building under 6,500 square feet. I've watched as the various components have moved around within the footprint, and I've seen creative solutions emerge as we've thought through the design requirements.

I'm sure that no one will be perfectly satisfied with everything about the new building, but I'm confident that we'll all be happy with the overall result. I'm grateful for the work of the Design Committee and our architects. May our new church be dedicated to the glory of God!



## ***A Tithe***

A tithe is a gift of 1/10th of income to the church. The concept was set in Jewish tradition since ancient times. It is part of our Christian biblical teachings and traditions. Historically, tithes were mandatory, and in some parts of the world, tithes are assessed along with taxes. For us, tithing is a personal and spiritual choice; but as we consider the gifts that we will return to God, the Episcopal Church asks that we hold the tithe as the minimum standard of giving. The 67th General Convention affirmed this standard.

It is recognized that few can begin their stewardship journey by immediately committing ten percent of their income to God. Those just beginning their practice of stewardship might start at a lower level, but pledge their hearts to working toward the ultimate goal of a tithe.
