

Vicar's Voice

I'm very proud of our Bishop's Committee for the work they're doing as the leadership team of our church. We had a very productive retreat day at Seabeck Conference Center on January 31 and we came away with some good results.

We looked over the responses of our parish survey, which you can see in this newsletter, as well as the written comments. Overall the results are very positive and we learned a lot from the written comments.

During the retreat we worked on updating the job descriptions for the members of the Bishop's Committee, and they are included in this newsletter as well. The custom of our parish is that each member of the Bishop's Committee takes responsibility for one of our commissions.

Of course, in order to do your job, you have to know what your job is, and that's what the job descriptions are for. Our BC members take their responsibilities seriously, and they're very conscientious. I hope you'll support them in all they do.

The ministers of the church are all the baptized people. Each of us is given a ministry by virtue of our baptism. So we prefer to call ourselves "ministers" rather than "volunteers." A volunteer is someone who is recruited and praised for their voluntary contributions, but a minister is a person called by God and acting out of love for God.

Our BC members are ministers in that sense. They have a calling to serve God in the church and they act out of a deep sense of vocation. I'm impressed that they're never autocratic or bossy, but they act as servants working for the good of God's church and for all the people.

The 1979 Prayer Book created a new emphasis on the ministry of all the baptized. It moved us away from thinking of church members as consumers to thinking of ourselves as ministers. All of us have a calling and a ministry in the church, even if it's simply praying for the church (which may be the most important ministry of all).

I hope you'll think about how God is calling you in your ministry in the church and in the world. We are all ministers!

Why We See What We See – The Cross

As I sit in church on Sunday mornings, my eyes wander around the altar and my mind wonders about what I'm seeing. So I asked, and Father Bill Fulton offered the following explanation which I'd like to share in case others are wondering also:

Our cross is a Celtic Christian cross, which is made distinctive by the circle superimposed on the arms of the cross. It is derived from ancient stone crosses erected in Ireland as early as the eighth century. Popular legend has it that St. Patrick combined the Christian cross with the pagan sun cross to help new believers accept the supremacy of Christianity. Another, more practical, explanation for the circle is that it makes the cross much sturdier and less vulnerable to breakage of the carved stone arms.

The symbol of the circle on the cross invites meanings of unity, wholeness, and inclusion. Christ "stretched out his arms on the hard wood of the cross that everyone might come within the reach of his saving embrace." (BCP, p.101) The circle represents Christ's embrace of all people and the wholeness he offers.

On the center of our cross are the letters "IHS", which signifies the first three letters of the Greek name of Jesus. Alternatively, "IHS" is sometimes interpreted as meaning "Iesus Hominum Salvator" ("Jesus, Saviour of men" in Latin). Stretching the limits of interpretation, some English-language derivations of "IHS" have included "I Have Suffered" or "In His Service".

Getting to Know You – Verbal Sketches of St. Antony's Parishioners

Living in the same house for forty-seven years isn't typical of most Americans, but Norma Tipton's combination of endeavors hasn't followed a typical pattern either.

Though a native Washingtonian (born in Chehalis), Norma lived in three states and Canada before settling in our area. Her address here has stayed constant, but, over the years, she travelled much of the globe: Western Europe, St. Petersburg in Russia, Korea, China, Japan, and Australia. And though she taught school for many years (elementary grades in Port Angeles and twenty-three years in the Home Economics Department at North Kitsap High School), she has also been a business partner and has devoted countless hours to volunteer work.

These various activities stemmed from her creativity and affinity to fabric crafts. Upon retiring from teaching, Norma joined four other women in a successful Poulsbo enterprise called Heirloom Quilts and Fabrics where she worked part-time. Norma says she loved handling the fabric, working with patterns and colors, and meeting people. A health condition led her to sell her share of the business but did not deter her from continuing a hobby she loves - quilting and sewing in general.

In fact, those hobbies could earn her the nickname “Ms Outreach.” Remember the beautiful red and white quilt that was raffled off last year and that brought over \$1,600. into our church coffers? That was Norma's work - two years of it!

Several years ago, she was told of the need for a quilting instructor at Purdy Women's Correction Facility in Gig Harbor. Norma responded to the call. When she arrived, she found an ill-equipped facility and few materials so she went to work putting together a program and soliciting donations. Today, after fourteen years of weekly evening trips to Gig Harbor, the women in the program not only have sewing machines and the know-how to use them, they also have a long-arm quilting machine that helps them make about three hundred quilts a year for charity.

Always open to new creative challenges, Norma has recently added making “surgical hats” to her repertoire. This aspect of her hobby started when her niece who is a surgery technician requested a cap with a “pig” theme. One request led to another and now Norma's caps, custom-made to the desired theme, bring delight and a touch of humor to the intensity of the surgery.

When she's not at her sewing machine, Norma likes to read, go to the theater, or just enjoy her three kittens - Violet, Sasha and “Sammy Mr. Minnie-Toes” (because he was born with six). At church, among other contributions, she helps with flowers and is a counter.

Like most of us, Norma is looking forward to the building of our new church. Unlike most of us, perhaps, she says - with a twinkle in her eye - that she has a unique wish she would like to see realized. When she was in Germany, she saw some church “door knobs” that she loved. They were beautifully molded in the form of a loaf of bread and a fish - most appropriate symbols, she suggests, as door openers for our church.

Given the number of things Norma has accomplished thus far, her wish for such special “door knobs” has a good chance of being fulfilled.

BISHOP'S COMMITTEE POSITION DESCRIPTIONS - 2015

Stewardship and Finance: Coordinates the organization and implementation of our Time, Talent, and Treasure, and provides leadership for the annual stewardship drive. B.C. Member is Bill Reeder

Outreach: Coordinates the sharing of our resources with the greater community through our participation plus distribution of funds. This will involve educating our communicants as to existing needs, how we might best share our resources, and encouraging everyone's involvement. B.C. Member is Liz Haney

Welcoming: Coordinates aspects of how we do Evangelism, especially inviting, orienting, and incorporating new members, including follow up with guests, welcome bags, pew cards, greeters, and participation in Military Appreciation Day. B.C. Member is Sylvia Campbell

Communications: Coordinates our communications, including internal and external publications (flyers, brochures, newsletter, bulletins, internal church publicity, and advertising) web site, telephone tree, photo wall, and collage. B.C. Member is Bill Demmon

Faith Formation: Coordinates all aspects of our formation programs for both children and adults; including Sunday School, Bible Study, Youth Group, Vacation Bible School, and other programs. Coordinates scheduling of nursery workers. B.C. Member is Charles Smith

Parish Life: Coordinates and implements a program of social activities, such as Coffee Hour, Dining Out group, Sunshine Fellowship, Soup Suppers, Tony's Trekkers, Epiphany potluck, Shrove Tuesday pancake supper, social outings, dinners, conferences and retreats. Coordinates lay pastoral care, including rides to church, updating the pastoral care list of caregiving, transportation, LEVs, visits to shut-ins, meals and special needs of members. B.C. Member is Loretta McGinley and Mark Westin (Carrie Rivers will help)

Environment: Coordinates the maintenance and upkeep of our grounds. This will involve regular cleaning of the premises through clean-up days, mowing the lawn, cutting and clean up of the hillside, clearing around the pond, pruning of the fruit trees, etc., that may be done by volunteers, or hired labor where appropriate. Coordinates the maintenance of our existing buildings and the purchase of the necessary supplies, such as toilet paper, paper towels, light bulbs, etc. Change timers with the seasons, program heat thermostats and do remodeling as needed or by BC decision. B.C. Member is Carrie Rivers

Building: Coordinates the design and development of new building and property. Obligations of the chair are to attend Bishop's Committee meetings, organize and chair the monthly Building Committee meetings and coordinate meetings between engineers, contractors, architects, Kitsap County Department of Community Development as needed. B.C. Member is John Stockwell

Worship/Liturgy/Music: Assist the vicar with coordination of public worship and offering any assistance needed to the choir director, Altar Guild, Eucharistic Ministers, Acolytes, and the Choir. B.C. Member is Bill Fulton and Mark Westin

Youth: Coordinates youth activities, the Italian dinner; as well as Diocesan JYC, HYC, and EYCs. BC Member is Carleton McKenney

Bishop's Warden

Oversee the smooth operations of the church through regular consultation with the Vicar; awareness of the work of parish commissions and Diocesan events; active participation in church functions; welcoming visitors, and attendance at both services on occasion. The Bishop's Warden has oversight of the following commissions/functions that concern administration and organization: Policy, Stewardship and Finance, Worship, Vicar, and Environment. Bishop's Warden is Penny Whitney

Peoples' Warden

Serve as liaison between congregants, Bishop's Committee, and priest, and address concerns and suggestions of parishioners regarding church matters. The Peoples' Warden has oversight of the following commissions/functions that concern activities of the congregation and outreach to the greater community: Outreach, Welcoming, Parish Life, Faith Formation, Youth, and Lay Pastoral Care. Peoples' Warden is Charles Smith

Clerk:

Attend Bishop's Committee meetings, special parish meetings, and the annual meeting, and take the minutes. Collect reports from all BC commissioners, the treasurer, the Vicar and other groups and email them to BC members before the meeting. Send out the minutes of each BC meeting, including formal minutes, reports, and supplements, to all BC members as soon as possible after each BC meeting. The clerk has "voice" at the BC meeting; however, the clerk is a non-voting member of the BC.
