There are several important events coming up in January that I'd like to draw your attention to. The first is a very exciting concert that our organist Chris Eisenberg has arranged for us on Saturday, January 2, at 7 pm. Maria is an award-winning American composer of classical music, and a critically acclaimed violinist, violist and pianist. Her husband Scott is an equally brilliant violist. Maria is the daughter of the Academy Award winning film score composer, Alfred Newman, and the cousin of the pop composer, Randy Newman. Maria prefers to perform at "boutique" concerts in small settings like St. Antony's. What an opportunity!

The next event is, of course, the Epiphany of our Lord Jesus Christ on Wednesday, January 6, which we will celebrate with Eucharist at 5:30 followed by a potluck with the Three Kings. Don't miss it!

Near the end of the month we will hold our Annual Meeting and Architect's Presentation at 10:00 am on Saturday, January 30. The Annual Meeting will include our usual reports and the elections of Bishop's Committee members and diocesan convention delegates. After that, we'll hear from our architects, Steve Rice and his team. They'll show us the plans we have made so far and explain how we came to those decisions. The architects and the design committee have been working hard for over six months, and we think you'll be fascinated by the results.

The next day, Sunday, January 31, Bishop Greg Rickel will make his visitation to St. Antony's at both the 8 and 10 am Eucharists. He'll confirm two of our fine young people, Aina Zabinsky and Benjamin Wentworth, and at least one adult. If you would like to take this opportunity to be confirmed or received into the Episcopal Church, please speak with me.

When a person is confirmed, they make a mature public affirmation of their faith, recommit themselves to the responsibilities of their baptism, and receive laying on of hands by a bishop. If you want to be received into the Episcopal Church from another denomination, you may be confirmed or received by the bishop. This who have experienced a renewal of faith or desire to renew their Christian commitment may also reaffirm their baptismal vows before the bishop.


