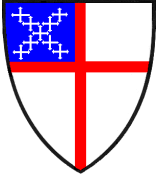

Vicar's Voice

At our Bishop's Committee retreat in February, we agreed that our main goal this year is to begin making the transition to our new church. Of course this includes the physical transition of moving our things to the new building, but there's so much more.

There's a saying, "We shape our buildings, and then our buildings shape us." Our new building will give us the opportunity to do things we haven't done before and to change what we're already doing. Now is the time to dream and imagine what we could be in the future. We hope to be in the new church by Easter 2017.

For instance, how will we decorate our new worship space? Some things will be the same, like our large brass cross, but other things will be new. What kind of new hangings for the altar and the backdrop can we create? How can we use our new space creatively? How will coffee hour change?

If new families are attracted to our church, will we have the capacity to incorporate them into our church life? We'll need to have plenty of teachers and classes for Christian education. What new programs might we need to put in place? Will we be able to invite new children into our acolyte program as soon as they start coming?

Would we want to re-invigorate our men's group or other ministries that might take on new life in our new church? What new offerings might we want to create for families from Bangor Base that we hope to attract? How might we reach out to these families to let them know we're at their doorstep?

Maybe we'll find new ways to use our grounds. Some people have mentioned a community garden, a labyrinth, walking paths, and picnic areas. How can we create these to help serve the people in our neighborhood? How can we make our church a community asset? What needs might we fill?

All these are questions for us to ponder as we imagine our new facility. I hope that we'll see the transition to our new property as not just a re-location, but more of a re-imagining. In the coming year, let's open ourselves to the Spirit of God as we brainstorm the possibilities.

Communication thoughts for April 2016:

- ◇ With Easter Sunday just past (and it sure was early this year, wasn't it?), that opens the rest of April and part of May as a great time to do communication-type things from our "springtime wish list."
 - Reading that section of the Bible you've always wanted to:
 - i. And then finding the time to share with others what you discovered on how God is communicating with you through reading of his Word.
 - Following up on your *two-way communication* list with God, - commonly called *A Prayer List*:
 - i. How many items of Answered Prayer can you note?
 - ii. As you pray, jot down notes about your new communications (i.e. update your Prayer List) about your "talks with God."
 - Actively communicate your Attitude of Gratitude.:
 - i. Easter, Spring Time, Longer and Warmer days, there is so much to be thankful for.
 - ii. How can you share with others your amazement and joy of the wonderful things God is doing for you this Easter and spring season?
 - Talk to your body:
 - i. Yep, it is "that" time again for a familiar (reoccurring?) event to commune joyfully with your cells and muscles ... with the activity of "getting outside and walking."
 - ii. A walk gives you some more private time to communicate: A time to listen to the quiet around you, or to children playing, or the birds awaking and singing in the early morning. Using a smart phone or portable CD player, you can even "read" a book during your walk.
 - iii. A walk gives you the time to capture the wonderful smell of another God-given new day as you set out on that 1st step you dreamed about during the cold winter rains: That post-winter daily walk to see the new flowers, the beautiful sunrises or sunsets, or to enjoy the chat with a walking companion.
- ◇ April is also a good time to ponder what wonder and growth spiritually can happen to you as God speaks afresh to you over the next five or six weeks about the anniversary of His marvelous and promised gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (May 15th). (See Joel 2:28, John 16:7, and Act 2:1-11)

Getting to Know You - Verbal Sketches of St. Antony Parishioners

As retirement considerations became a reality, Gary Hicks had little hesitation deciding where he wanted to live. He had been attracted to the Pacific Northwest since the early 90's when he began visiting his sister in Forks and his mother in Sequim. Since he had had six years active duty on nuclear submarines and an additional seventeen years in the naval reserve as an Engineering Duty Officer, the concentration of facilities available here to naval retirees was an added draw.

During his military service, a degree in general engineering from the University of Illinois (Urbana-Champaign) served him well. It also led to an MBA from the University of California (Berkeley) and a thirty-year career as an engineering consultant and project manager. Licensed as both a mechanical and electrical engineer, Gary's expertise is in the area of computerized control systems with experience in a variety of industries - power, pharmaceuticals, and mining, for example. His work covered much of the United States from the Mississippi westward, and he had projects in Alaska, Canada, and Mexico as well. More recently he held a management position with HDR Engineering in Sacramento as Engineering Director for Hydropower Services.



Though "officially" retired, Gary still has clients requesting his services so absences from home are sometimes required. For the most part, however, he is able to pursue several special interests and hobbies. An avid hiker, he participates in outings with Tony's Trekkers and the Monday Hikers. His life-long interest in photography led him to join a club in Silverdale where he is taking a course to enhance his skills using a digital camera. Amateur radio is another interest. Recently he was pleased to attain his second level General License in that field. Then there's one more area he hopes to pursue before too long - boating. He has always been interested in sailing, crewed on a boat in San Diego, and hopes some day to crew again or even have a boat of his own.

Enthusiastic as he is with the Pacific Northwest, Gary is equally pleased to have found a church to his liking. An Episcopalian for many years, he did a bit of general exploring before an Internet search led him to St. Antony. Here, in his words, he "found a perfect fit."

We are very pleased that Gary's move last July from Folsom, California to Port Ludlow also brought him to our congregation. We look forward to expanding our "getting to know you" acquaintance in the days to come.
