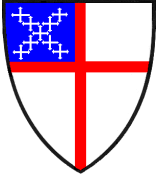

Vicar's Voice

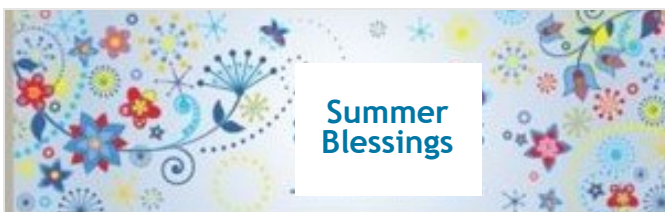

Building Committee

What a good presentation by Steve Rice of Rice Fergus Miller-Architects Sunday June 12th. The design of the church is complete. Steve presented the design and explained the thoughts the Design Committee used to reach the final design. During the meetings of the Design Committee many compromises were made to keep the project on budget. Many thanks to the members of the Design Committee and the architects for completing the design. The next step was to apply for building permits. I am happy to tell you that the permits have been submitted June 20th and we have received notice from Kitsap County DCD that the permits are accepted as complete. That means we delivered a full permit submittal with all the needed paperwork. The county now has up to 90 days to review and approve the application.

During the presentation on the 12th Steve Rice presented the plans for the Out Door Shelter to be located on the south side of the new church. This space can be used for outside services, weddings, vacation bible school, festivals and many other activities. The possibilities are exciting. Currently the shelter is unfunded. All the timbers and the design have been generously donated by Steve Rice. We are waiting to get cost of construction from our contractor. When the Design Committee receives the cost to construct they will ask the Capital Campaign Committee to reach out to the congregation and others that may wish to donate to raising the shelter. I am sure that you will be impressed by the shelter when completed.
