Vicar's Voice

As we get closer to the completion of our new building, the anticipation is growing. What will it look like? How will we furnish it? What will the colors be? Every Sunday after the 9:00 Eucharist, we make a prayer procession around the four corners of the building to ask God's blessing, and each time I get a better sense of what it will be like.

The building itself has been well designed. All the details have been painstakingly planned by the architect and the design team, and I'm sure it will be a huge success. But there are a number of things that have yet to be determined. For instance, what kind of hangings will we have behind the altar? How will we furnish linens for the new altar? What kind of vases and stands will we have for flowers? The list goes on and on.

Fortunately we have a memorial fund to help us with these extra details. Over the years, people have generously donated funds to St. Antony's in memory of loved ones. These funds are usually meant to be used for things that are enduring, especially things for worship, such as silver vessels for Communion, a musical instrument, a baptismal font, or a columbarium. Sometimes funds are designated for a specific purpose, although all the money in our memorial fund is currently undesignated, and can be used for any purpose.

Currently, due to the generosity of our donors and the magic of the stock market, we have over \$120,000 in our memorial fund. Clearly we need to make wise decisions about our memorial fund purchases. For this reason the Bishop's Committee has decided to form a memorial fund committee. If you would like to be on this committee, please contact me or Charles Smith, our Bishop's Warden.

The committee will look at our available funds and the various potential uses for them. We'll create a list of priorities and make recommendations to the Bishop's Committee. If you have ideas for the committee, I hope you'll share them with us so we can make the best decisions. My thanks to all who will be part of this process.

The beginning of EfM at St. Antony's church has been postponed. We are considering starting in January if we meet the minimum of six enrolled. The participants from St. Paul's are forming their own program, overseen by Amma Kathleen, for the specific purpose of raising up folks to work in ministry at St. Paul's.

EfM at St. Antony's will have a broader focus. We are inviting folks who have a hunger to deepen their own spirituality and to name and develop a sense of "ministry" by being in a seminar relationship with a small group of souls who share the same hunger. The center of the EfM year focuses on building a sustaining spirituality that is built on the three pillars of scripture, tradition and reason. We learn the process of Theological Reflection from the ground up. This process hones our ability to listen for insights that lead to implications for ministry of all kinds by focusing our reasoning skills and opening our hearts. All through the year we explore what kinds of ministry we are already engaged in and with careful listening to the Spirit and to each other, we discover where God is next leading us. This may be about ministry within the church, but also certainly includes how we minister at home, at work and in the greater community. It is spiritual formation to be ready and available for whatever we are called to do, and however we are called to be.

Please pray about participating in EfM. May you hear God's whisperings and consider enrolling.



Little Sisters of Saint Clare News

Our 2017 Convocation was held August 9-11th at the beautiful Archbishop Burnett Retreat Center in Federal Way.

The first event, a business meeting, was an historic time as we voted to ratify a Constitution, Customary and Community Rule after many years of discernment. Following the business meeting, we celebrated Eucharist together led by our Chaplain, Mother Katherine Sedwick, followed by a service of healing prayer and anointing. The evening ended with procession of the Blessed Sacrament housed in our Founder's monstrance to a small side "chapel" where Exposition continued for private prayer for the duration of the Convocation.



The Convocation ended with Eucharist on August 11th, Saint Clare's Feast Day. Clothed in our brown habits, we gathered to place our revised Rhythm of Life documents on the Altar as we renewed our vows including the words: "I seek to spread the knowledge and love of Christ, to promote the spirit of love and harmony as the family of God, and to live joyfully a life of simplicity and humble service after the example of Saints Clare and Francis. I undertake, by God's grace, to keep for this year my personal Rhythm of Life."

The Convocation was a joyful, spiritually nourishing experience for all.

"I was in prison and you visited me." - Matthew 25:36c

Some people feel uneasy about doing this. Is there any way to visit or care about those in prison, to love even these neighbors, without going inside the prison?

Yes.

"It is important that every minute of the Kairos weekend is covered by prayer. Every team member must solicit the prayers of God's people to insure that this is done. When the prayer vigil is visually displayed to the Participants by means of a prayer wheel they gain a sense of their worth in God's kingdom and the power of prayer in their lives." - Kairos Program Manual for Kairos Inside, p11

I (Charles Smith) will be part of the Kairos 61 team at Monroe. I will have a prayer vigil available for sign-ups (first name only please) from Sunday 24 September through the services on 15 October. The Kairos weekend is 19-22 October. The prayer vigil is wherever you happen to be at the time you volunteered to pray.

Other options include:

There are costs involved with Kairos and all donations are welcome and fully tax deductible. The easiest way to do this is to use your St. Antony's pledge envelope and just write Kairos on the "other" or blank line. Please make a similar note on the memo line of your check. This will allow your donation to be included on your donation report from St. Antony's. If you prefer to donate directly, please make that check payable to Kairos of Washington State and give it to me, Charles Smith. I will turn it in along with the information necessary to ensure you receive a donation statement from Kairos next January.

We share God's love with the participants through agape. This comes in several forms, two of which I described above. Another is general agape, typically a poster or a letter sized sheet of paper filled with encouragement - words or artwork. It should state where it is from. If the sender(s) wish to sign it, please do, but just with your first name please. There is also personal agape, this is hand written letters of encouragement to the 42 participants. Typically the letter begins 'Dear Brother in Christ'. All 42 letters are hand written, no copies, because of the powerful message of love it sends to receive an original, hand written letter. Please put each letter in its own envelope, sign with just the first name, but do not seal them - they have to be reviewed by prison security. These can be given to me, Charles Smith, and I will turn them in along with my own letters.

Come and See... Go and Tell/Cursillo is Diocese of Olympia's expression of the global Cursillo/Fourth Day ministry. On a weekend retreat, a guest encounters overwhelming love as a beloved child of God, accompanied by Christ's healing and grace, leading to discovery of what it means to live out one's baptismal covenant and be radically sent by Jesus into the world. Youth Report

Godly Play Program

Youth are now back to school, which also means back to Sunday school! This year a new program, Godly Play, is being introduced for **children ages 3-12** (older children who are interested may join as well, or observe a class; talk to Mary Zabinski or Kathy Little to schedule an observation day or let them know you will be joining the class as a student). **Sunday School for the children begins September 24.** Children may come to their classroom in the modular between 8:50 and 9:00 am, just as church is ready to begin.



Godly Play offers a creative, child-honoring way of entering into and experiencing the biblical story. In Godly Play, we play with the language of God and God's People: our sacred stories, parables, liturgical actions and silence. Through this powerful language, through our wondering, through the community of players gathered together, we hear the deepest invitation of all: an invitation to come play with God.

Because we treat the Godly Play classroom as a "sacred space," greeters will help each child at the door become ready to enter the room quietly. Children will leave the room one at a time after receiving personal words of blessing and affirmation from the teacher and be shepherded back to rejoin their families for Eucharist. Teen Faith Formation

Children ages 13 and up are invited to participate in a Journey to Adulthood program with Fr. Bill during the week. He will contact families soon to schedule a date that works well for the group. If your teenage children would be interested in a Sunday Bible study during the 9 am service, please let Fr. Bill know. We have materials for a class if there is interest.

<u>Christmas Pageant</u>

Practice for our Christmas Pageant begins Sunday, November 12, right after the 9 am service. (Children will have some "coffee hour" snacks available for them in the modular.) We'll have a short practice after church each Sunday until our dress rehearsal on Saturday, December 16, 9 am - noon. The pageant itself will be Sunday, December 17, during the 9 am service. The script for the pageant will be the same as last year, with a few edits.

Mission trip

Convention

The diocesan budget for 2018 is among the items that will be voted upon during convention. Charles has a copy available for review. There will also be motions. Those have not been received as of the date when this article was written; however, they are expected by the end of September. Please see our delegates for a chance to review and to provide your comments on these motions.



Treasurer and Stewardship

I have been blessed for 5 years now to be St. Antony's Church Treasurer. Often I am told the church is blessed for having me, but I am convinced it is the other way around. This is because the generosity of our parish makes my job easy. If we are ever trending to be 'in the red,' I just have to point it out, and the deficit is closed by your generosity.

We traditionally limp through the summer months scraping by, due to vacations and travel being a priority over coming to church. This usually puts us in the red at the end of the summer, which we catch up by Thanksgiving. This year, we are in the black at the end of August. This is all the more remarkable because in the same month we raised over \$29,000 for the Event Shelter at the new church, \$1,125 for the Lord's Diner in memory of John Steller, and over \$1,800 for hurricane relief!

As Treasurer, I am the one who is blessed!

Next month, we launch our annual stewardship drive. Again, financially, you make my job easy. But there is one area I want to challenge everyone. You may have noticed a subtle change in our services. The lector has been reading both passages before the gospel reading this month. This change wasn't made to make writing the schedule easier, it was made because we don't have enough people volunteering as lectors. This is symptomatic of not having enough people volunteering at all. I challenge everyone to think about how you can help the church and our mission through volunteering. Maybe reading in front of people isn't your thing, but there are plenty of areas we can use your help. Your time is as important as the financial gifts you are so willing to give.

Please reflect on your talents and how they can serve God through Saint Antony's.

Building to Serve - God's Field of Dreams Capital Campaign

I simply cannot believe that we are rapidly coming to the official end of our three year capital campaign. Since November 2014 we have experienced so many wonderful gifts here at St. Antony's. From the work we did during the capital campaign, to the outpouring of financial support, to the hours spent in design with the architect, and now as we watch as our new building grows evermore week by week. None of this could have been possible without all of your support!

With the end of this calendar year comes the official end of the Building to Serve - God's Field of Dreams Capital Campaign. Our pledged total has grown over the years with new members and newfound support to over \$467,227. Currently we are 3 months and \$60,538 away from the goal. I am writing this article today not only to celebrate our many successes, but as a reminder that our fundraising work isn't over just yet. We were able to raise nearly \$30,000 in just two weeks for the Event Shelter, and I am hoping now we will come together to reach the goal of \$467,227 by December 31st. So if you have an outstanding balance, or plan to make a large donation at the end of the year, please make sure it is received by the church no later than December 31st so it can be attributed to the capital campaign.

2018 will be a very exciting year for St. Antony's! We will move into our new church. We will create new ministries to better serve our community from our new space. We will also continue to look to the future. Perhaps you remember that when we started this building project it was Phase 1 of a 2 phase plan. With vision to the future we will need to plan financially for it as well. So I graciously ask that if you have gotten into the routine of giving, that you continue. While the capital campaign will be totaled out, the Building Fund account will still happily accept donations. In the short term they might fund current construction costs, offset any remaining balance or mortgage accrued from the building project, and hopefully start a nest egg so to begin Phase 2 of construction.

Thank you all so much for the dedication that has been shown to this project throughout the years. I think we have surprised everyone, even ourselves at times, to the level of devotion to our Field of Dreams project. Jesus called us to "Go therefore, and make disciples of people of all the nations" (Matthew 28:19), and our generous gifts (above and beyond our regular offerings) will enable St. Antony's to do just that.
