Vicar's Voice

I'd like to thank the outgoing members of the Bishop's Committee: Penny Whitney, Liz Haney, Mark Westin, and Bill Demmon. They've accomplished a lot in their time on the BC and I greatly appreciate their time and talent. I'm especially grateful to Penny Whitney for being our Bishop's Warden for the past two years. Her support and encouragement have helped me a great deal.

At our annual meeting on January 28, we'll elect new members of the Bishop's Committee and begin a new cycle of work together. We'll begin with a retreat day for the Bishop's Committee on February 11. At our BC retreat, we spend time getting to know each other, we divide up the various commissions, and we work to set our goals for the upcoming year.

The responsibilities of the Bishop's Committee include leadership for the congregation (setting a vision, creating goals, and seeing the big picture) as well as management (setting policy, managing finances, and guiding programs). One of the best ways of becoming involved at St. Antony's is to join the Bishop's Committee where you can see all the ways we carry out our ministry.

The BC operates under the Canons of the Diocese of Olympia which define the work of the BC and the Vicar. In the Episcopal Church, decisions for a mission church such as St. Antony's are made by the Bishop's Committee. As a mission of the Diocese of Olympia, we are under the control and supervision of the Bishop.

Our BC meetings begin with a short Bible study so we can remember the ministry that God has given us. We continue with a report from the Treasurer, Jim Foley, who gives us a comprehensive view of our finances. We then take up whatever business is at hand, which may be program or scheduling decisions, policy matters, or perhaps a new challenge or opportunity that has come up.

At our retreat, we set expectations to set the tone of our meetings for the remainder of the year. We agree to be respectful of each other, to listen to all members, and to keep confidentiality. I think our meetings are effective and energizing - not just another dull meeting!

I hope that you'll appreciate the good work of our Bishop's Committee and do all you can to support the members of the Bishop's Committee. If you're asked to serve on the BC in the future, I hope you'll consider it prayerfully. You might be surprised to find that your time on the Bishop's Committee has been some of your best time at St. Antony's!

St. Mark's Cathedral Needs Our Help

Bishop Rickel recently sent an invitation to all the congregations in the Diocese to participate in a capital campaign to repair and update our aging cathedral in Seattle. He wrote, "St. Mark's Cathedral is a house of prayer for all people; a loving, welcoming and inclusive community that nurtures faith, encourages service, and promotes social and environmental justice; and a sacred gathering place for the Diocese of Olympia and the broader community in times of crisis, sorrow, and celebration."

At clergy gatherings, I've come to know Steve Thomasen, the Dean of the Cathedral, a big-hearted, imposing figure. He told me, "This is the cathedral for the whole Diocese. This is your cathedral." Many of us have attended functions at the Cathedral and recognize its importance in the Diocese and in our region. Now the cathedral needs our help.

Construction on the Cathedral was begun in 1928, but the stock market crash of 1929 and the Great Depression interrupted its construction. The original plans were never completed. According to Bishop Rickel, "The Cathedral is showing significant signs of an aging infrastructure and is in need of revitalization and improvement. In recent years, the exposed concrete breaking away from exterior walls has posed a safety risk, and there are significant energy inefficiencies that need to be addressed."

Given a choice of several options to participate, our Bishop's Committee chose to have a congregational appeal each year for three years. Bishop Rickel suggested the season of Lent, so we will provide an opportunity for our members to make a contribution during Lent. You may write a check to St. Antony's with "Cathedral Campaign" on the memo line, and we will send it on to the Cathedral with all our contributions together.



Faith Formation

Building Team

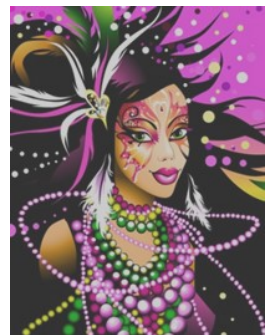
October 18th St Antony's received the "Comments Document" from the Kitsap County Department of Community Development-DCD. On January 4th, the response was delivered to the Department of Community Development (DCD). I was notified on January 26th that some additional questions are now being asked by DCD. These must be addressed in a new response to DCD. This again will temporarily delay the issuance of the Site Development Activity Permit (SDAP). Since the Building Permit cannot be issued until the SDAP is approved the building permit is on hold. It is hoped that questions may be quickly answered and the permit received very soon. The congregation is to be congratulated regarding the Capital Campaign. Pledges are on track and at this time a little more than 75% of the pledged money has been received. With just 11 months remaining in the campaign the committee feels confident that the pledge goal will be accomplished.

With the delay in the permit process the Transition Committee has been asked to update the information binder to be sure plans are accurate. Since New Fellowship Church now owns the building and our agreement only gave us 15 months of co-occupancy contingency plans need to be in place if we must exit our current location.
