#### Vicar's Voice

At our annual meeting on Saturday, January 19, we'll have elections for members of the Bishop's Committee and delegates to Diocesan Convention.

Diocesan Convention will be held at the Lynnwood Convention Center on November 8 and 9. Our delegates (one male, one female) will take part in the workshops, worship, and business sessions of the convention. I think of diocesan convention as the annual family reunion of the diocese where we see the wider circle of Episcopal churches with all their diversity and creativity. You really get a sense of what's happening in the diocese.

Those elected to the Bishop's Committee will begin the year with us at our Bishop's Committee Retreat on February 2 at St. Nicholas Episcopal Church in Tahuya. On that day we'll work on team building and planning for the year ahead. We strive to create a dynamic, forward-thinking, proactive team that is productive and fun to be part of. The retreat is also time for some joking around, getting to know each other, and a good leisurely lunch.

Each person on our Bishop's Committee is assigned a commission. Actually we negotiate among ourselves so that each person gets the commission that best suits them. Sometimes we change the commissions to reflect the gifts and abilities of the members of the BC. We're flexible!

Each commission has a job description to clearly outline the duties and responsibilities of the BC member who leads it. This means the members of the Bishop's Committee form the leadership core of our church. The energy, focus, and vision in our church come from the members of the Bishop's Committee. It's an exciting group to work with.

Currently our commissions include: Stewardship and Finance, Outreach, Welcoming, Communications, Faith Formation, Parish Life, Environment, and New Facilities. If we have a youth member, that person leads the Youth Commission.

The Vicar appoints one person to be the Bishop's Warden and the members of the BC elect one of their members to be the People's Warden. In addition, we prefer to have a non-BC member to serve as our Clerk (it's difficult to participate in a conversation and take minutes at the same time).

I think we've had a very successful and enjoyable Bishop's Committee in 2018, and I'm looking forward to the next year and the opportunities we have to thrive and grow as God's people in this place and time.

Please contact Father Bill or Beth Rohlfing if you would like to join either the Lay Eucharist Visitor Ministry or be a part of the Pastoral Care Team.


