Vicar's Voice

Even as we prepare ourselves for the move to our new building, I'd like to look ahead to this summer when I'll be on sabbatical. Due to generosity of our Bishop, I have the opportunity to step back from everyday ministry and take a two and a half month sabbatical. In my absence, the Revs. Dick Scott and Craig Vocelka will preside and preach at the Eucharist and be available for emergency pastoral care.

A sabbatical has been defined as "A period of time, usually three months, when ministry leaders and congregation set aside the leader's normal responsibilities for the purpose of rest and renewal toward sustained excellence in ministry. It is not an extended vacation, but is meant to be a release from the daily routine of ministry for the physical, emotional, spiritual, and intellectual well-being of the ministry leader."

The word sabbatical is drawn from the word Sabbath, which means "rest." The fourth commandment is, "Thou shalt keep the Sabbath." Just as God rested after the creation of the world, we also are to rest at intervals. Jesus affirmed the importance of rest by regularly finding times to escape from the demands of his ministry for prayer and renewal.

I have several goals for my sabbatical. They include rest and renewal; reading for my professional advancement; visiting other churches; spending time with my family; and a weeklong silent retreat at a Benedictine monastery in New Mexico. I'll reflect on the arc of my ministry up to now, and seek new energy and vision for the years ahead. I plan to be around for some time yet, and I want to be fully engaged as long as I am at St. Antony's.

While I'm gone, our lay leaders will take over many of my normal functions including the usual administrative, pastoral care, and worship planning duties. A sabbatical offers a parish a chance to experience life without their regular clergy leader, and this can be a good learning experience. It's also a time when we can reflect on our goals and our vision for the future.

I have every confidence that this sabbatical will be a time of refreshing for all of us, and we'll begin our fall season with renewed spirits.

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The mission of St. Antony's is to be a loving and welcoming people who worship God, grow in Christ, and serve others. Gather, Grow, and Go!

If you are not sure where to start I would suggest you use a search engine such as Volunteer Match (https://www.volunteermatch.org). It will provide you a list and description of organizations in need.
