**VICAR'S REPORT – Bill Fulton**

**Move to new building**

Over the last month, we have moved completely out of the old building. Thanks to the good planning of Peter Stockwell, many people helped make the transition. The sacristy, office, Godly Play, nursery, choir, and kitchen have all been moved to the new building, although most things remain in boxes so that we don't "occupy" the building. The piano and organ are in place, thanks to John Stockwell; all the ashes have been transferred to the columbarium, thanks to Dick Scott; and the copier and computers are hooked up and working in the office, thanks again to John Stockwell.

**Outdoor Worship**

We've had outdoor worship under the picnic shelter the last three Sundays. Everyone has been very adaptable and the weather has been excellent. My thanks to our musicians and to all who have helped set up and take down the chairs and the altar each Sunday.

Because we have no occupancy permit, we have had no Wednesday Eucharist or program the last two weeks and Linda and I have been working at home. Linda has been very resourceful in getting the bulletins done and sending communications to the parish.

Then I will install a picnic table on the gravel to provide a space for picnics, crafts, and small gatherings. I will also need to clear some brush to allow for sufficient space."

**New Diocesan Policy concerning keys to the building**

2019 Goals Updates/Progress:

***Complete the design of God's Garden:*** Placed announcement in June newsletter seeking people to work on the design committee. First meeting will be held right after we take occupancy of the new building.

***Facilitate development of St. Antony's 5-Year Plan:*** This goal has somewhat changed. We are heading in a different direction than I had planned. We are following Father Dick's direction for the discernment process and I am unsure of the outcome. It may not be a 5-year plan. The goal will be adapted as we proceed. Placed an article in the June newsletter regarding congregational discernment while Father Bill is on sabbatical.
