#### Vicar's Voice

I feel very fortunate to have been granted a sabbatical leave for ten weeks this summer, the first sabbatical l've taken in twenty four years of ministry. It begins Monday, July 1. I hope to use my time wisely, for my benefit and for the benefit of our congregation. Most of the funding for this sabbatical was provided by Bishop Rickel. The remainder comes from a fund in the church budget that we have built up over the years.

The budget and calendar for the sabbatical was approved by the Bishop's Committee at our December 2018 meeting. In my absence the Revs. Dick Scott and Craig Vocelka will provide coverage for Sunday Eucharists and urgent pastoral care needs. Because we're familiar with both Dick and Craig, I'm sure that everything will function smoothly in my absence.

Administrative duties will be handled by our very capable secretary, Linda Robuck, our Bishop's Warden, David Wilkinson, and the members of our Bishop's Committee. Our Pastoral Care team will continue to provide day to day pastoral care visits and calls. In short, I'm confident the parish is in good hands through the summer.

Although I'll be traveling for a good deal of the sabbatical, I'll be at home for intervals between trips. Because the intent of a sabbatical is rest and renewal, it's considered best if the pastor completely disconnects from the parish during the sabbatical period. So I'll be away from St. Antony's completely during the sabbatical.

My sabbatical plans include a six-day silent retreat at a Benedictine monastery in New Mexico; time with my mother and my family in Colorado; a watercolor painting workshop; time with Katy and our sons and daughter-in-law in Hood River, Oregon; a trip to Alaska to see old friends and visit the church that sent me to seminary; and a backpacking trip in Olympic National Park. I have a long list of books to read, and I'll visit other Episcopal Churches on Sundays.

We'll offer prayers to mark the beginning of the sabbatical period during the Eucharist on Sunday, June 30, and we'll celebrate the end of the sabbatical when I return on Sunday, September 15. From time to time I'll post updates on my blog, "The Vicar's Brain," which can be found on the church website, so you can check the blog if you want to watch my progress. May God bless all of us during the time of this sabbatical.

### Caring for Our Beautiful Steinway Grand Piano

Once the dust has settled and the cover is removed from our Steinway grand piano, you will hear how wonderful the piano sounds and see that the finish on the piano is absolutely beautiful. This piano is now one of the finest pianos in Kitsap County. Please help us keep our piano in good condition by observing the following guidelines:

- Place NOTHING on top of the piano. No books, no pencils, no papers, and especially no food or beverages.
- Do not lean or brush up against the piano. Anytime someone comes near the piano, there is a very real possibility that zippers, buttons, watches, rings, and fingernails can scratch it.
- Do not touch the piano unless you are playing it. Fingerprints and hand prints will detract from the beautiful finish. We don't always want to be spending our time buffing out finger prints.
- Keep the piano covered unless it is in use.

Because the children of our congregation will probably not be reading this article, I ask that the adults at St. Antony's please teach the children how to take care of the piano.

The piano is meant to be played. If you are a trained pianist, please feel free to play the piano. Children who are taking piano lessons are also welcome to play the piano (with adult supervision). If you or your children have had no piano training but you would still like to try playing the piano, please stay after the postlude on a Sunday when I am the musician. I'd be happy to have you give the piano a try.

This piano, having been purchased from memorial funds, is not just a musical instrument for our church; it is a memorial to many of our beloved members who have gone before us. Let's keep our beautiful Steinway grand piano in great condition.
