**VICAR'S REPORT – Bill Fulton**

**Stewardship Banquet**

Our stewardship banquet on November 22 was a fabulous event with over 50 people attending, all of whom thoroughly enjoyed the evening. The social hour and the banquet were elegantly prepared, and the atmosphere was convivial. The stewardship talks were heartfelt and to the point. What a great way to celebrate our stewardship campaign. My thanks to David, Kristin, and Sarah for their creativity and hard work.

**Organ repair**

The organ technician replaced the CPU that was ruined by a spike in the electricity, and then he found that the amplifier had also been damaged by the same spike. After speaking with Joann, I gave him approval to replace the amplifier with a stock amp and a kill switch. This is cheaper than ordering a new custom amplifier from Allen Organ Company that would not need a kill switch. The organ will be ready for Christmas services. I anticipate that the total bill for the organ repair will be \$2,000 to \$3,000. I hope the Memorial Committee will approve this as an expenditure from the Memorial Fund.

At our last meeting we agreed to send the letter of agreement with Central Kitsap School District to the Diocesan Chancellor. I got an email saying that she read it and approved it; however, I have not seen the copy signed by the Diocese yet.

The outdoor planter pots approved last month will be picked up and delivered this week. I had the privilege of joining Barbara Fox of the Diocesan office to sign the mortgage documents November 26. I have also been contacted by the mortgage company that all documents have been recorded and funds dispersed. Funds were paid to the Diocese of Olympia and to Kitsap Bank. The diocese will forward the balance of funds after receiving their portion for their loan. During the cold weather the temporary landscape piping froze in two locations. I located the water meter for the landscaping (meter near the barn) and shut off the water.

I have contacted the architect regarding the few punch-list items still outstanding. I have received confirmation that progress is being made to resolve the outstanding issues.

Since the church building is complete, I recommend that the New Facilities Committee be disbanded and the ongoing functions be absorbed by other existing commissions.
