Vicar's Voice

I remember when I opened my first checking account with my mom when I was 16 years old. I had a part-time job and my parents thought it was time for me to learn how to keep a check register and manage my money. I was thrilled with the power of a checkbook. I could write something on a piece of paper and turn it into money! And so began my long love affair with my checkbook.

With the advent of online banking, however, I've gradually stopped writing checks. All my banking is now online, and the only paper checks I write are to the church for my pledge. I've continued to do this because I think it's important to put my check in the offering plate every Sunday to go on the altar to be blessed. Every Saturday night, I write my pledge check and put it in the pocket of my clergy shirt so I won't forget it in the morning.

Now, however, that will be changing. I'm going to start giving my pledge online, using the donation page on our church website. It's quite easy to use, and I can have my pledge come right out of my checking account. We use a secure service from Vanco, a big money transfer company, so I don't worry about it being hacked.

But what about putting my check in the offering plate? We've come up with an answer for that. In the narthex you will now find a red mug filled with laminated cards that say, "I Gave Online." When I come in, I'll pick one up and slip it into my prayer book. When the offering comes, I'll put the laminated card in the offering plate as a sign of my offering to God and God's church.

I know many of us prefer to write paper checks, and that's perfectly fine. But for those who use online banking for their everyday bill paying, our online donation system may be a better way to pay a pledge. I know that many young people use online payments exclusively, and they expect their church to offer banking services using current technology. With our online donation system and the "I Gave Online" cards, we can do that.

I once was told, "Never come before God empty-handed." As our ushers bring the offering plates to the altar, we can know that our offering to God is coming forward to be blessed, whether it's with a check or with an "I Gave Online" card.

From the Archives by Bill Fulton

The following letter is from the Archives of St. Antony's. It was written by Bishop Cochrane to Jerry Sullivan to encourage the founders of our church as they began to organize the new Silverdale mission (it didn't even have a name yet). Next month we'll have more letters from the Archive.

October 10, 1985

Dear Jerry,

Greetings in the Name of Our Lord Jesus Christ and congratulations to you and all of God's people who gathered last Sunday to organize the developing congregation in Silverdale! I can't begin to express to you my joy and excitement about what is taking place there in the establishment of this newest piece of mission work in our diocese. Thank you all for your commitment which has been expressed not only in your willingness to serve but also in your generous gifts and pledges of money to begin this work.

By this letter I do hereby appoint you, Gerald Sullivan, to a three-year term on the Bishop's Committee and also appoint you to serve as Bishop's Warden. I do hereby appoint Cdr. Michael Adams to a one-year term on the Bishop's Committee and also to serve as People's Warden. I do hereby appoint Mrs. Michael Adams to serve as Treasurer. The following are hereby appointed to terms on the Bishop's Committee: Mrs. Ruth Lindstrum, Mr. Donald Taylor, Mrs. Dorothy Lynch, Mrs. Patricia Beswick, Mr. Ralph Berggren, Mr. Daniel Schremser, and Mr. Michael Lux.

Finally, it is extremely important that we choose a name for this new community as soon as possible. I understand that you have already received our list of possible names. At your next Bishop's Committee meeting please go over the list very carefully and select three names which you deem would be appropriate and send them to me. I shall choose one of them for the new congregation at Silverdale.

My God bless you all, and by the power of His Holy Spirit, give increase to the work you have so splendidly begun.
