Vicar's Voice

As we move into the season of autumn, it's time for us to think about our stewardship campaign for 2021. This year has been topsy-turvy, compared to most years, and our stewardship campaign will probably also be different this year. Our theme for our stewardship campaign this fall is "Desert times, desert discipline."

In the Bible, the desert is the place where the Hebrew people are formed and shaped into the people of God. Their experience during the forty years of wandering in the desert created their identity as God's chosen people. And Jesus went into the wilderness for forty days in a kind of vision quest when he overcame the temptations of the devil. The desert is a harsh place, but it's a place of discipline and formation.

It seems to me we're going through a desert time today. The Coronavirus pandemic has made it impossible for us to meet in person as we always have, and we've had to impose a strict discipline on ourselves in order to stay safe. We wear masks, we keep social distancing, and we stay at home when possible. We've found ways to worship without being in the same room, and we've found ways to keep in touch. But it has required a certain discipline.

In the same way, I think God is calling us to be disciplined in our stewardship during this time. The people of Israel learned to live in a harsh climate in the desert, and they found that God sustained them. The pandemic has created a lot of uncertainty and it has kept us apart physically. But as God's people of St. Antony's we're committed to supporting our church family and maintaining our close ties of friendship and support, even in this desert time.

Someday the pandemic will be over and we'll resume in-person services without fear of the coronavirus. But until then we have to stay disciplined. I hope that as we think about our stewardship of our St. Antony's family this fall, we'll remain committed to the vision and the people of St. Antony's.

HOME AID BREAD

This may be of interest to you if you think you have had to give up some serious "attend church in person" time these last few months. I know I have felt a big loss in not having the assembling of ourselves together under one roof. Take a look at what some other people have had to give up.

In the Jewish year there were 52 Sabbaths, 12 New Moon festivals, 8 days for Passover and Unleavened Bread, 1 day for Feast of Weeks, 1 day for Feast of Trumpets, 1 day for Atonement, 7 days for Feast of Tabernacles, 30 days for morning and evening sacrifices (2 hours daily), an average of 52 days for each year from the sabbatical year, and an average of seven days for each year from the year of Jubilee---a total of 171 days. Add to this the feasts not commanded by God, such as Purim, Dedication, Wood-Carrying, etc.; the time for going and coming to and from the festivals; the time spent for private and personal devotion, and it adds up to one-half year of the individual person being devoted to religious and moral improvement either in activities or dedications.

At least we all can continue saying our prayers no matter what and no matter where.

Thank you for the phone calls too. It is always nice to hear from one another.

In Person Services

When we reopen our building for in-person attendance and we continue our remote video services, there will be several notable changes. We will all be working together to keep everyone as safe and healthy as possible as we meet together again.

Everyone will be required to wear a face covering or mask and practice social distancing while they are in the building. There will be only one entrance, which will be the door in the small gathering room near the kitchen. When you enter you will be asked several health questions prescribed by the CDC. Then we will move into the narthex where there will be a registration station. We will be required to sign a "contact tracing" form before we can continue into the nave. The "contact tracing" is required by the CDC and the Diocese of Olympia. After signing, please move from the narthex to nave and be seated without delay to avoid gathering together. The chairs in the nave have been rearranged to provide social distancing while we are gathered together. Throughout the building there will be hand sanitization stations for health safety.

During the service there will be additional instructions about, reading the lessons, singing, coming forward and receiving communion. We will all need to work together so we can worship together in-person safely. I am looking forward to seeing the masked faces of everyone as they return the building.

Thank you very much for your special gift to help provide face masks to those who could not afford them. Thanks to you, several distributions were possible.

The prison received the first distribution and requested 200 more which I promised to provide. When I made the second distribution, the officer in charge of the prison said thank you for fulfilling your promise. Apparently that does not always happen at the prison. It is something the prison ministry will endeavor to do. The general rule is no pictures at the prison and I did not ask for an exception.

I am part of Truth is Light (TIL). TIL Children's ministry began a radio program when CoVid-9 would not allow them to continue in-person. The radio station started requiring people to wear face masks, so we helped them.

The fourth distribution went out through the hospital. They serve refugees who are not eligible for the government-provided face masks.

The fifth distribution went to the refugees in Mugujai, where we also work with the church leaders to help with discipleship.

But I've been joining a Centering Prayer group every Wednesday morning as a way of connecting with other prayerful souls to do centering prayer. The leader of the group is the Rev. Dianne Andrews, the rector of St. Paul's, Port Townsend. If you go to their webpage and scroll down, you can find the invitation to their centering prayer group on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays at 9:00 am.

Dianne, or another leader, starts the session with a short invitation to prayer that helps settle us into silence and then the ringing of a gong begins twenty minutes of silence for centering prayer. It sounds strange to sit in silence with other people on Zoom, but it feels supportive and strengthening. We're all together virtually and it seems to work.


