In this time of coronavirus, we've learned to adopt a kind of discipline to our lives. We've learned to wear face masks, keep our social distance from others, limit our trips to the grocery store, stay at home as much as possible, and resist the urge to travel. We've learned to shrink our world into our immediate surroundings.

All this takes a kind of discipline that's required for us to survive until an effective vaccine is found and distributed (I hope that day comes soon!). It's not unlike the discipline that the people of Israel endured when they fled from Egypt and wandered in the desert. During those forty years, they learned to conserve water, find pasture for their animals, and respect their leaders. That discipline is what formed them into the people of God

Our stewardship theme this year is "Desert Times, Desert Discipline." We can't physically come to church these days, so we're learning a discipline of worshiping remotely by livestream. It's not as satisfying as being in church with our friends and fellow parishioners, hearing the music and receiving the bread and wine. We don't get that human contact that we thrive on. But we're disciplining ourselves to remain faithful in our relationship with God and each other.

I believe our budget in the coming year should be a disciplined budget that maintains what is essential so that when the times comes to open fully, we'll be ready to start up with renewed energy and focus. "Desert Discipline" means that we are committed to supporting our church through these desert times. Soon you'll receive a pledge card in the mail with a letter asking you to make a financial commitment for next year. I hope you'll prayerfully consider how God is calling you to walk with the people of God at St. Antony's in the coming year.

I realize that some of us have had financial setbacks because of the economic recession, and I want to assure you that your prayers and presence are just as important as your financial pledge. Stewardship is about our time, talent, and treasure, and sometimes we're able to give of our time and talent more than our treasure. For those of us who have been able to maintain our financial footing, I hope we'll continue in our faithfulness and generosity. Thanks!

Each year, hundreds of homeless and at-risk youth come to Christmas parties held by The Coffee Oasis. They come to share dinner, sing Christmas songs, hear the Christmas story, and open gifts. While the Family Christmas Project will look slightly different this year due to COVID-19, you can still help give youth hope and a home this Christmas." They are requesting \$50.00 per youth, the campaign will run from November 28th through December 20th.

Community Garden Planning By Bill Fulton

A small group met on Zoom on October 6 to brainstorm about a community garden at St. Antony's. We were reminded that Jesus calls us to feed the hungry, and a garden that produces food for a food bank is one way to answer this call.

We know there's a lot of knowledge among the people of St. Antony's about gardening and we'd like to hear about the best ways to set up a garden.

Several people at the meeting questioned whether we should be inviting the general public to come on our land, at least for the first year. Unless we're very orgalized and prepared, it could lead to chaos.

It was suggested that before proceeding, we need to have an overall plan for our church property that shows the intended uses for each area of the property (landscaping, gardens, overflow parking, wetlands, etc.). Deacon Bill agreed to create a map to show our future land use.

It was generally agreed that anything we do for the coming year would start in the spring and would be small and experimental so that we could improve upon it the following year.

We agreed that the idea of a common garden is a good! idea, but it needs considerable planning before we move ahead. We scheduled our next Zoom meeting for 16:30 pm, Tuesday, November 10.



Holding on to Hope: A National Service for Healing and Wholeness Presiding Bishop and National Cathedral Host Live-streamed Prayers on Nov. 1

[October 15, 2020] Presiding Bishop Michael Curry will lead a live-streamed prayer service from Washington National Cathedral, *Holding on to Hope: A National Service for Healing and Wholeness*, on All Saints Sunday, November 1, at 4:00-5:30 p.m. EST. In the midst of pandemic, racial reckoning, and a historic election, the live-streamed service will gather Americans for prayer, song, lament, hope, and a call to love God and neighbor.

The service will feature an ecumenical and multifaith array of voices, musical offerings, and prayers. Using a combination of live and visually stunning pre-recorded elements gathered from across the nation, the service will be live streamed in English and Spanish.

"The Washington National Cathedral has gathered Americans for prayer at the death of presidents, after terrible tragedies like 9/11, and in moments of joy and hope for our nation and our world," says Bishop Curry, "As the people of the United States cast their votes for the office of president and many other offices throughout the land, we gather to pray to the God who is the Creator of us all. We pray that we might learn to stand and hold each other's hands as the children of God."

In addition to Bishop Curry's sermon, the service will include reflections from Father James Martin, a noted Roman Catholic commentator on American life and values, and Valarie Kaur, an inspiring Sikh author, filmmaker and civil rights attorney. The gathering will be officiated by Washington's Bishop Mariann Edgar Budde, Cathedral Dean Randy Hollerith, and Reverend Stephanie Spellers, Canon to the Presiding Bishop.

Prayers for the nation will come from leaders like Eboo Patel, founder and president of Interfaith Youth Core (IFY); Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America; Rabbi Shoshana Conover of Temple Sholom, Chicago; and Shane Claiborne, speaker, activist, and best-selling author. Music from The Coro de la Cathedral of Christ Church Cathedral-Indianapolis and Washington National Cathedral will help to lift and open hearts.

A live prayer hotline in English and Spanish will be open during the service, staffed by Episcopal clergy and chaplains, in partnership with Virginia Theological Seminary and General Theological Seminary. The hotline will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. EST from November 1 to November 5.

The prison ministry team explored Mark 3:13-19 as Godfrey asked "Is Jesus calling to us?" Three members of the team shared how they came to Jesus. Godfrey patiently waited to offer his own answer.

"Yes, Jesus is calling me. I was in S1A when, somehow, I was chosen to be the Greek Master. I did

not know how to be a Greek Master." Encouraged by his mentors, he gave his best. God blessed his effort. "They wanted to make me chairman next year."

He said 'no'. However, he accepted a role of increased responsibility. In his S4B year he accepted the chairmanship. "My classmates expected the chairman to take communion," Godfrey said, "but I did not have a good relationship with Jesus." By the end of his S4B year Godfrey accepted Jesus as his Lord and savior, been baptized, and received his first communion.



The testimonies excited the team members. We all expressed an eagerness for the day when we can re-enter the prison.


