#### Vicar's Voice

Public health experts are telling us that the worst of the coronavirus pandemic is yet to come. This winter will see the highest number of cases and deaths before warmer weather and the vaccines begin to take effect.

In the winter, we want to get together with family and friends, and we aren't able to get outside as much, so the chances for transmission of the virus are far higher. There was a large increase in cases after Thanksgiving, and it's likely that there will be another bump after the Christmas holidays.

The miraculous vaccines are bringing great hope for everyone, but it will take months for enough people to take them to slow the spread of the virus. Experts are saying that it may be summer before a large portion of the population has received a vaccine and we can begin to relax our vigilance.

I think we're all experiencing some form of pandemic fatigue. We're tired of wearing masks, staying at home, avoiding restaurants, and postponing travel. Discipline and sacrifice are unpopular but necessary qualities to draw on during this time in history.

Nurses, caregivers, and doctors have taken the worst of this pandemic. ### Virtual Annual Meeting Guidelines By Bill Fulton

This year we'll have a virtual annual meeting on January 30 using the Zoom platform. Like everything else during this crazy pandemic, we'll have to learn some new skills to make this work.

State law allows for virtual meetings by telephone or electronic media as long as everyone attending has real-time access (in other words, emails or messaging won't work for meetings). Bishop Rickel has established guidelines for our virtual annual meetings to make our annual meeting go well and meet legal guidelines.

The Zoom platform is set up well for meetings, as we've found during our monthly BC meetings. If you don't have computer access, you can easily dial in and participate by telephone. Anyone may make a motion, make a nomination, speak to the group, or participate in voting. We'll explain everything before the meeting so everyone understands the procedures.

I hope you'll take the time to connect to our meeting, either by computer or by telephone, and participate in the governance of our parish.



## Land Acknowledgment Statement By Bill Fulton

At the 2019 Convention of the Diocese of Olympia, a resolution was passed encouraging all congregations to study land acknowledgment. According to the resolution statement, "Every church in the Diocese of Olympia stands on land that was occupied prior to Euro-colonial contact. In most, if not all cases, this land was taken, without permission, with or without force from peoples who had stewarded the land from time immemorial."

A land acknowledgment is a statement that recognizes the indigenous peoples who were traditional stewards of the land before white contact. Many institutions, such as colleges and churches, have adopted land acknowledgements as a way of bringing to light what has long been overlooked or suppressed.

A simple land acknowledgment might be, "We recognize that the land on which our buildings stand has been traditionally stewarded by the Suquamish and Duwamish peoples who continue to live in this area."

In our Bishop's Committee meetings, we've been studying how we might create a land acknowledgment for St. Antony's. It might be published on our website, on our bulletins, or other public documents. In this small way, we're attempting to right past wrongs and overcome past injustice. Members of the BC welcome your comments.
