For over a year, we've refrained from meeting together in person for worship. A small handful of us have celebrated the Eucharist in church in front of the camera, and we've livestreamed our services so that everyone can participate online. We've been highly disciplined as a congregation so that no one could become susceptible to the ravages of Covid-19.

We've all learned to participate by peering at our computer screens and our phones. We've adapted. We've been faithful in our worship of God. But it's just not the same as coming to the house of God and being in God's presence with each other.

We've missed each other. We've missed seeing the faces of our brothers and sisters. We've done the next best thing through phone calls and Zoom meetings, but it's not the same as seeing each other face to face.

When Jacob was re-united with his brother, Esau, after a long absence, he said, "Truly, to see your face is like seeing the face of God." That's how I felt last Sunday when we finally resumed in-person worship. How good it was to look out from the altar and see the faces of the people I love! (Even if they were covered with masks)

For the time being, we'll continue to wear face masks and stay six feet apart. We'll also continue to livestream our services for those who don't yet feel safe in a public setting and for those who can't physically get to church.

Our Parish Life team organized a delightful parish picnic on May 21, and they have another planned for June 5. We have two memorial services this summer (Mac Mackimmie and Nick Nickerson), as well as Kirsten and Thomas's Wedding. As more of us become vaccinated and the number of Covid cases in Kitsap County continues to fall, we can do more and more together. I'm relieved and thankful.

After meeting with Arienne Davison, the Canon for the Ordinary at The Diocese of Olympia, on Zoom regarding our next vicar search, the first steps have started.



Do you ever wonder why we refer to deepening our faith as "faith formation", as opposed to "Study of the Faith" or some other such designation? How does "formation" differ from study?

The passive form of faith formation is, to me, a reminder that faith is a gift that comes from God. I have children who describe themselves as "spiritual, but not religious", and it reminds me of a question posed by Marcus Borg when confronted by students who did not believe in God: "Tell me about the god that you do not believe in." Ours is a God who reveals himself, initially through various ancient religions in the world, including Judaism, but to us, finally, in Jesus Christ. Most of us have had some direct experience of God's action in our lives, although it may take some practice to perceive it. But we know that encounter with God's action is "formative"—it changes us. It is not we who decide to change—we are changed, Faith formation is a practice in which we expose ourselves to the spirit through prayer, meditation, study and mutual sharing with others in the confidence that we will be changed.

I am interested in hearing from any of you who are willing to share on your own experience in this regard, as we think about what we as a church community offer to our "spiritual but not religious" friends and any who are curious as to why we persist in our Sunday ritual of worship when we could be out playing golf.

Outreach

The Gospel call to care for those most in need is taken seriously at St. A's - we are a generous congregation and it's a blessing to be part of the Outreach Ministry. At our May Outreach Team meeting, we chose to make monetary contributions to three of the organizations we are supporting this year: Coffee Oasis, Kitsap Community Resources - Kinship Caregiver Program, and to the Episcopal Relief and Development organization.

Sylvia Campbell is our point of contact for Coffee Oasis and shared the following:

"The Coffee Oasis is a faith-based, non-profit organization established in 1997 as a facility to serve the needs of street youth ages 13-25. Today there are centers in Bremerton, Port Orchard, Poulsbo and Kingston.

The mission of The Coffee Oasis is to restore communities through compassionate youth programs and coffee businesses.

All proceeds from the sale of coffee and cafe offerings are used to provide homeless youth with the resources they need to thrive. To carry out programs, regular staff relies heavily on volunteers willing to establish relationships with young people.

Besides providing mentoring, temporary and/or long-term shelter, The Coffee Oasis also makes job training and internships available.

We plan to invite a representative from Coffee Oasis to give a talk to our congregation in the near future. More to come.....

This year, St. Antony's is 'adopting' a family through the **Kinship Caregiver Program** offered through Kitsap Community Resources (KCR). This program offers support to grandparents and relatives raising children when biological parents are unable to do so.
