

Charles Mission News

October 20,2021

Mugujai Graduation

The first group of computer skills students in Mugujai finished before the groups in Entebbe. However, because some of the graduates needed to travel to Kenya to work on the citizenship of their newborn, we delayed it further. Then the extension of the lock down delayed it again.

They completed in February 2021, but the graduation was 30 August 2021. We could not hold it in the church's originally planned; but we were permitted to gather and hold graduation. Leaders of other denominations (not represented in the graduating class) and the local political leaders were invited. Several accepted the invitation to attend, and the invitation to speak at the graduation. Everyone who spoke talked about the positive effect the computer skills class has had on the community

and their desire to see the program expand and reach more people, particularly the youth.

Earlier in the program I mentioned how the program came to be and the delay in starting it. Several people in Mugujai have solar power; however, it was not until one of the missionaries I am working with through Truth is Light agreed to put an inverter on his solar power system that it became possible. Now that it was possible to recharge a laptop, it was possible to hold class without killing the battery while people were trying to work on computer skills. The church leaders and local political leaders spoke later, and all want the program to continue and grow, but none of them talked about adding an inverter to any other solar power systems in the community. I will have to follow up on that in the future.

Prison Ministry

There is a lot happening at the prison even though it is still closed to all program (Ministry). Bugutu prison was used as a quarantine center for all West Nile for 18 months. (Bugutu is one of the neighborhood regions of Koboko and is where the prison is located.)

It took 18 months but Corona Virus finally found its way to prison. Those who tested positive received medical treatment and were returned to Bugutu prison.

The deputy officer in charge has contacted me to request Bibles. I was able to obtain a few English Bibles but the translation uses words that are difficult for Ugandans. I will continue to look for simple English bibles, Kakwa bibles and Lugbara bibles.

The prison ministry team continues to meet and review passages fo the gospel

of Mark. This is growing us in the word and as a team. The day will come when we can go back inside; God willing, we will be ready.

<u>Thanksgivings</u>: For those interested in prison ministry!; God's guidance on how to enjoy his blessing in this waiting time, and for the Computer skills graduates.

Prayer Requests: To be able to resume in the prison' ministry and for God's continued guidance and blessing.


