Faith Formation - Youth

We are getting the youth education programs up a running after having to take a break due to shutdowns. To do this, we need your help in one of two ways. Helping with our younger children and adolescents/teens. Remember there are many roles to fill and any help you can give would be great!

If you love reading, helping toddlers/young children learn about God's love, and, a structured curriculum. Godly play is for you. If we can get a handful of volunteers, we can rotate Sundays. I do want to send 2 people to godly play classes as there is set curriculum (you do not need to reinvent the wheel). This program is set for Sundays only.

If you want to be mentor and facilitate adolescent/teen spiritual growth, we need you. Unlike Godly play, this program is more flexible to meet the needs of our very active youth. Outreach

Many thanks to Janet Steller and Donna Hilton for their continued help to provide meals to those in need at the Salvation Army in Bremerton. Thanks to their efforts, a donation of \$1000 from the **Brandenburg Fund** was approved by the BC to be sent to the Salvation Army.

St. Antony's Outreach funds continue to support the **Kitsap Community Resources** (KCR) Kinship program, and there is a recent story a KCR case worker shared with us:

A Grandmother has custody of and has been caring for her 2 grandchildren since birth (they are now ages 2 and 4). Other family members have helped ... and she says, "we have always had just what we need & plenty of love to fill in the space some might fill with things". However this year the family suffered a great loss as a key member passed away suddenly. This led to not only heartache, but also unexpected expenses.

The Grandmother asked for only enough to pay the rent, but with y our help (from St. A's) and that of our other departments (at KCR)...we not only paid the rent...but were able to get some back bills taken care of & a reduced fee implemented on the energy bill moving forward. This Grandmother and grandchildren were the recipients of your June Donation to help with all things a safe and happy home need, and will continue to receive ..support until we can see them into self-sufficiency again.

Community Volunteer Opportunity. (Information provided by Elizabeth Flagg)

The Committee has been exploring ways that we might reach out to the community. One of the opportunities that presents itself is to volunteer our time at a local charity such as we've done at the Salvation Army and The Lord's Diner.

We have a charity at work in Silverdale commonly known as The Discovery Shop. The Discovery Shop sells gently used goods and clothing which go to support cancer research and education. The Shop is staffed totally by volunteers who commit to working 1 day a week for 4 hours either at the checkout counter or in the area where goods are received. Volunteers help potential customers providing information, ringing up sales or the area where goods are received. In the latter area, sorting donated items, perhaps laundering them or sewing on a button. The shop will also be putting on special events. For August, they are planning on having a chef make demonstrations and kitchen items will be spotlighted in the shop.

The manager, Joyce Kelly, phone 360-613-4139 says that volunteers are always welcome and is the person to contact for further information. If this is something you end up deciding to do, please let Loretta McGinley, our Outreach Committee Chair or another member of the committee know.

Getting to Know You: Charles & Elizabeth Moorhead

Both Charles and Elizabeth have eastern roots: Charles grew up on a farm in northwestern Pennsylvania; Elizabeth was born in Beverly, Massachusetts near Boston. Serendipitous circumstances determined their destinies. Following Elizabeth's family's move, they ended up attending the same high school in Harbor Creek, Pennsylvania though they didn't know each other at that time. A quirk of circumstances brought them together. Home from his first year of college, Charles was visiting his high school wanting to look up a former teacher. School was in a new building and he didn't know the teacher's location, but a pretty young girl in the empty hallway was able to give him requested directions. Two days later they met again at a young people's gathering place, and three years later they married. Last June 1 they celebrated their fifty-ninth anniversary.

"Eight-o'clockers," Charles and Elizabeth were active at Saint Charles in Poulsbo from 1982 until Charles left for Virginia in 1991 to become the Commanding Officer of the Naval Ophthalmic and Training Activity. Elizabeth then began attending St. Antony's for a year until she joined Charles in Yorktown. In 1997 they both became members of Saint Anthony's under Fr. Dick Scott when Charles retired from the Navy and they moved back to Silverdale.

Charles's naval service included eight years as a helicopter pilot and instructor, followed by graduation from optometry school and practice as an optometrist. During much of this time, Elizabeth taught in elementary schools in first and second grades with a three-year stint in sixth grade in Texas. When Charles retired from the Navy after thirty-two years of service, he established private optometry practice in Bremerton while Elizabeth taught in the Central Kitsap School District.

Throughout their time at St. A's they have been active, contributing members. Elizabeth has been on altar guild for many years and continues to serve in that capacity. She was also on Bishop's Committee, the Search Committee that selected Fr. Fulton, and she is a reader and Eucharistic Minister.

Since retiring (Elizabeth in 2009, Charles in 2010), they have spent much time "on the road." Their "trip of a lifetime" was a three-month tour of New Zealand and Australia, carefully planned and orchestrated by Charles who says planning their trips is like a hobby for him. They both eschew tours and imposed itineraries, preferring instead to set their own agenda and means of transportation: trains, planes, car rentals, whatever. In Charles's words, "a little bit of everything." Elizabeth adds that they like to stay in B and B's because they "like to meet the people." Usually they travel somewhere during four months of the year, sometimes overseas but more frequently here at home where they have visited every state in the Union. Despite having covered so much territory, they still have one more wish to fulfill—a trip to Acadia National Park in Maine.

Besides travel, another ongoing interest is genealogy. Elizabeth's American roots go back to the early 1600's in New England with a relative on the second ship after the Mayflower. Charles also has ancestors from early New England and even older from Yorktown, Virginia. He likes to say when Elizabeth's relatives arrived, his were in America to tie up their boat. In their extensive research, in addition to identifying ancestries, they have made two

surprising discoveries: the first - they are actually ninth cousins; the second - one of Elizabeth's relatives was hanged as a witch at the Salem witch trials.

What interesting and unique information they are able to pass on to two sons, a daughter, and five grandchildren!
