INTERIM VICAR'S REPORT - Craig Vocelka

November 9, 2022

Dearest Ones,

I write this with much on my mind. We are quickly approaching the end of my Letter of Agreement (LOA) concerning my time with you as your interim vicar. The agreement was that I would serve to the end of 2022 or to when the person you called to serve as your next vicar arrived. It is obvious that December 31st will arrive before the new vicar which leads to question – how do we go forward?

I am willing to continue in my current role with the understanding that Victoria and I have made plans for several trips which will cause me to be away more than the time allotted for vacations. The first trip I have planned is the Holy Land Pilgrimage with Bishop Rickel in January. We then have a trip in March for 10 days and then I will be gone for five weeks in May-June. I do not know of other plans at this time but do know that my brothers and I are trying to plan a Bro Reunion when we can find a time that works for all of us.

I'd like to propose that for the most, these times when I will be away will be Leave Without Pay (LWP). The one exception will be one week when I am in the Holy Land to compensate for the personal retreat time I have not used this year. If this arrangement is acceptable to you we can rework the LOA for these arrangements. I will do everything possible to arrange for clergy to cover the Sunday's when I will be away.

We will be able to discuss this in more detail with Arienne at the meeting on Sunday.

The next concern I have is financial. As you are all aware, we currently are not meeting budget and next year will be an even greater challenge. As I mentioned a few Sundays ago, I will not be asking for or accepting the Cost Of Living Adjustment (COLA) that was approved at Diocesan Convention. However, it will need to be included in the next vicar's salary as well as the medical insurance which I am not collecting from St. Antony's. I mention this to make certain that those of you who will continue to serve on the BC in 2023 are aware of these challenges.

Next, we must start now to find people to serve on the BC in 2023! This will be a most important year in the journey of St. A's as the BC will be the final step in calling your next vicar. You know how workload has increased this year with the vacant seats. I believe two people will be stepping down at the annual meeting which means we will need to fill 5 or 6 positions.

I was so happy to read Julie's report about the meeting last night! I pray this is a start of something big for St. A's!!

Regular schedule


Epiphany. Friday Jan 6
