#### **SEARCH COMMITTEE LIASON – Sarah Rogers**

#### Greetings BC!

The Search Committee has been hard at work meeting weekly to prepare for the onslaught of work we are about to receive. We must move quickly since applicant's careers, homes and families are all waiting for their next call. While a final recommendation will not come for several months, we are very busy as we move toward first and second interviews, site visits, tours etc with each potential candidate. Thankfully we have been given a healthy number of candidates to consider, but that only makes more work for us. We must also be careful to listen to God and take time to prayerfully discern each step. The Diocese has laid out no less than 11 compartmentalized steps we need to complete for each candidate.

Our committee is working well together with different voices and points of view all coming together to represent our entire congregation with the aid of the Profile.

We have just received the vetted names from the Diocese and are well under way. While we cannot see the future or predict God's plan, we would like to believe we would submit a name to the BC by the end of the summer to have our new Vicar in place by the start of Advent.

In anticipation of domestic travel to visit and interview applicants we ask that the BC has cash on hand from the Search and Sabbatical Fund to pay for travel expenses to include but not limited to airfare, car rental, hotel and food for two people for each candidate we need to visit.

I also ask does the church/BC have a Zoom account I can access so that we can hold first interviews via Zoom? We need a full paid version because we expect interviews to exceed the 40 minute free version. If we do not have an account I can access, then I will purchase one, and submit the charge for reimbursement as we will need this ASAP.
