VICAR'S REPORT – Mother Hillary - (Term started October 2)

I only have a week and a half to report on, but it's been a delightful week and a half.

Worship and Spiritual Life:

On my first Sunday with you all, we blessed our beloved animals in honor of St. Francis. The 8am service had 16 attendees, and the 10:15 service had 76. I also had the opportunity to join our contemplative prayer group last Wednesday as well as our Thursday afternoon Bible study on John, faithfully led by Esther (and by Marj during Esther's convalescence).

Additionally, the Liturgy & Arts Team will reconvene this Monday, October 16th at 1pm at church-- so far this team includes Joann, Mark, Ruth, Sarah, Linda, and myself. We'll be choosing music and looking ahead to the next liturgical events, such as All Saints, Thanksgiving, and Advent/Christmastide.

I'm interested in resurrecting the mid-week Eucharist and/or a Vicar-led formation series soon.

Pastoral Care: I was able to join the Pastoral Care team last week, and I had a chance to visit Vivian Durfee (currently on hospice) for prayer and Eucharist. I'll also be hoping to visit two other parishioners at Brookdale as well as Barbara Steadman at Northwoods soon. I'm prioritizing some of our sick or shut-in parishioners for visits in effort to get to know them early, and I've been appreciative to the BC and Pastoral Care team for referrals--keep them coming!

Community Relationships: Rick and I have reached out to Rabbi Emily at the synagogue in Bremerton to offer support and prayers. I hope to meet with Rabbi Emily on the morning of Monday the 16th.

Administration:
