Good people of St. Antony's, summer is nearly upon us! We are having longer days with more and more sunshine, and I can't get enough of it! I hope you find time on those sunny days to sit and bask in the warm light, even if just for a few minutes. To me, that always felt like a hug from God.

In the summertime, especially here in the Pacific Northwest, the need for important repairs often arises! Our lovely building here at St. Antony's is no different. We are due for a major repair on our septic system early this August, which will cost upwards of \$15,000 dollars. Be Still and Know That I am God

St. Antony's Contemplative Prayer group has invited The Rev. Paul Rietmann to speak 9 June from 11:30 am - 12:30 pm following the 10:15 am service for a talk entitled, 'Be Still and Know That I am God'. The Rev. Paul is a retired Episcopal Priest from the Diocese of Olympia who leads retreats, book discussion groups and meditation sessions, and he's been inspired by eastern meditation practices to teach and guide ways to engage in Christian contemplative prayer. All are invited to attend this talk to gain a better understanding of ways to inwardly quiet ourselves, to be still and open to the presence of God within. Who doesn't need more inner peace in the midst of personal dilemmas and crisis world events? Please join us for this presentation which will explore a brief history of Christian contemplative prayer, and introduce a few, simple prayer practices that will invite us to turn inwards and rest in stillness.



Our Contemplative Prayer group meets in the St. A's sanctuary the first and third Wednesday of each month from 12:00-1:00 pm. All are invited to attend a time of quiet gathering, contemplative prayer practice and reflection. The ability to sit still with a peaceful mind for a long time is NOT a requirement to attend!! Rather, all are invited to engage in a contemplative prayer practice, e.g. Centering Prayer, Lectio Divina, and to bring a gentle and kind attention to one's self and attentive ear to the stirrings of God's presence within. Any form of prayer is a practice - and practice involves a repeated turning towards vs. sole focus on an end goal. The yearning to abide in the peace of God is an example of Divine presence within you. Attending to that yearning and turning inwards through contemplative prayer can open you to the Divine within, and bring a greater sense of inner stillness and presence of God through life's ups and downs. Check the Results from the Landscape Survey

Results are in! We learned a lot from our recent Landscape Survey. In all, 41 members submitted information. It took parishioners an average of 15 minutes to complete the few questions that the Landscape Committee presented.

First, almost everyone agrees that we should formulate a plan with guidelines for care, use, and design of the acreage and buildings at St. Antony's. Only 3 people said they weren't sure.

When you ranked items of interest in order of importance to each one of you, they shook out like this:




2. Flatten area near picnic shelter

3. Update flower beds

4. Perimeter Walking Path

- 5. Memorial Garden
- 6. Make the Barn Usable
- 7. Labyrinth
- 8. Other

Furthermore, the greatest number of respondents said that we should preserve the front lawn area for curb appeal, an open sightline to the church, and space for games and events. This includes gatherings such as the "Trunk-or-Treat," Easter Egg Hunts, and games at picnics.

St. Antony's members are "doers" and "givers!" Most respondents said that they would donate time and/or money to the outdoor aspect of our beautiful church. In addition, many offered up special talents as a means to help. This might include special skills and knowledge in plant care and placement, landscape drawings, construction, and more! Invitation from the Counters!

Greetings, church family!

To ensure that a church runs smoothly, there are many chores to be done, just as there are in any household: meals, cleaning, gardening and bill paying...About the latter: just as we have to keep our home finances current by knowing how much comes in and how much goes out, so too does the church.

St. Antony's has a treasurer, Jim Foley, who oversees the flow of accounts: income and expenses. Our receiving treasurer, Melo Scanlon, assists in this work. They are volunteers, and this is a big job! However, we have a team of volunteers that help them do their important work. These are the Counters!

Two counters are needed each Sunday. These two counters are responsible for tracking the money that is placed in the offering plates. After church, their work is to record the incoming checks and any cash that is in offering envelopes into the Treasurer's accounting system. Each offering is then applied to the giver's account so that they can track their progress on their yearly giving and progress on their pledge.

This work invites you to give of your time and talent in service to the community; therefore, it is a ministry! We need two counters each Sunday, and lately, we have only had enough for two Sundays a month. Why two counters? Firstly, two people are required so that they can work together and vouch for each other. A team can serve the fiscal responsibility of the Church to any and all who entrust it with their money. Secondly, the work goes faster with two people working together! Checking and rechecking is easier and more efficient as a team.

Counting is responsible work, but it's not scary work. No accounting experience is required: it is basic arithmetic, not complex mathematics. We especially need some new counters who are comfortable doing simple data entry on a computer. Ideally, one computer-trained counter would serve on each weekly team of two. This ministry is "sitting in the counting house, counting out the money" while others may be "eating bread and honey!"

So when worship ends, the counters get our coffee hour goodies and then head back to the office to do our work! Counters are needed; we will train you for this simple but incredibly important ministry, and the whole community will be deeply grateful for your service. Thank you!
