We will kick off the month ending the Season of Creation on Sunday October 5, where we will celebrate the Blessing of the Animals. The following Sunday, October 12th, will be our Bishop's visit! This Sunday is not to be missed! We will get to hear Bishop Phil preach and we celebrate confirmations, receptions, and reaffirmation before communion at both services. In between services, Bishop Phil will be around for a Q&A during Episcopal 101 and will consecrate our bell tower, likely right before the 10:15 service begins. After that we will enjoy a wonderful brunch-themed coffee hour put on by Kathy G., so be sure to chat with Bishop Phil at coffee hour before he leaves to meet with our Bishop's Committee. The liturgical color of the day will be red for confirmations!

And finally, October brings the beginning of our yearly Stewardship Campaign. This year, we are celebrating 40 Years of Prayer, remembering and honoring our 40-year history as the Episcopal mission to Silverdale. As we plan our finances to close out 2025 and plan for 2026, you will get to hear stories from parishioners who have been with St. Antony's from the beginning all the way to those who joined us within the past 1-2 years! The BC and I hope these stories inspire you as you and your family plan your giving for this last quarter and your pledge for 2026.

This year has been wildly exciting, with new families, new events, new partnerships, and new property projects, like our new sign and Rain and Memorial gardens. It has also been a tough year for us financially due to two big surprises: our mortgage payment increased by about \$700 a month and our tenants moved out in early July, so we lost \$2300 a month in passive income. In addition, we had to spend some money on important cleaning, repairs and maintenance to prepare the house for the next tenants. Without those big surprises, we would have been well ahead of where we originally budgeted, thanks to your support. With your continued support, we are well able to tackle these challenges together.



Charles Mission News

Mission Vehicle

It has been an exciting couple of months. It has also come with challenges and I have been eager to work through those challenges before writing. Three months ago I received the used Lan Cruiser Prado that was offered for sale. You probably remember that I was fundraising with intent to buy a newly imported, lightly used one. I still had a significant amount to raise when God opened the way to get this for the ministry using the funds that had been raised, and help the seller (a known friend) resolve a financial crisis of their own. When the vehicle was turned over to me, I wanted to have it blessed. I made arrangements to do it at the end

of a prison ministry team meeting.

Towards the end of our meeting our guests began arriving. Some of them, like the vicar of St. John Birijaku, would like to join us for all our activities. I hope he, and all of them do. Unfortunately, they were called for another meeting too. They did their best to accommodate both of us.

Now that the vehicle is paid for, insurance is purchased, the Ugandan road tax is paid, and the car is blessed, it is time to get it into the ministry.

Not so fast. It is not performing well. The mechanic I was planning to work with moved to South Sudan. Recommendations led me to another mechanic and we

made plans to get the car back in good performing service. The prison ministry has gone on for five years without its own vehicle, a few more days was not that long to wait for the ministry to have this benefit. All in God's time.

We (the mechanic, myself, and the prison ministry team) thought everything was repaired. Satan was not happy. The cam-shaft broke on the way to ministry at Lobule prison. The mechanic came out to the vehicle and spent the next serval days taking apart, inspecting, repairing and rebuilding the engine. Now we have successfully used it for prison ministry for a month. IF that was not blessing enough, during the same month two prisoners at Lobule and six at Gbukutu (Koboko main) prison gave their life to Christ during the ministry visits.

Kairos Uganda

Kairos Prison Ministry International (KPMI) recently held their annual conference. The general sessions were recorded and I am watching them, together with the prison ministry team here in Koboko, Uganda. In the process we discovered a pleasant surprise. The CEO of KPMI referenced us when telling the conference about the exciting growth the international side of KPMI is making.

All of Kairos Uganda is involved. Tomorrow I will be traveling to Kampala with the leadership of Kairos Koboko to meet with the national leaders of Kairos Uganda and the leadership team they are building for Kairos in a prison on that side of Uganda. WE will be conducting advisory council training and talking about how we can and will—live into that growth the CEO of KPMI mentioned. (Continued on next page)
