Computer Skills Graduation

The 5th computer skills graduation in Mugujai was well attended. Most of the people, including the LC1, a low-level government official, were on hand at the announced start time! Our reputation is growing. These things were not the case for the previous graduations, people came late, especially the local councilors. We also had all our graduates, from both Mugujai and Birijaku, in attendance. Another first.

We (the host and I) still delayed starting the program. For the first time, a high-level government official, a resident district commissioner (RDC), had accepted

our invitation and we knew he was in the car on the way. At one hour after the announced gathering time (thirty minutes after the scheduled start) we called the RDC. He said he was in Mugujai and had just driven past the turn; however, he had just stopped for directions. Five minutes later he arrived.

Two of the graduates had brought their wives. In both cases, as we took our places in the church, they tried to sit in

the open seats of the front row, only to discover that these were being saved for the graduates who would process in last.

During the speeches the student representative, Ayume Charles asked me to set up a data center in Mugujai where they could work. Side note: my Uganda visa allows me to conduct ministry like teaching, but I am not allowed to be an employer in Uganda. Uganda's way of protecting those opportunities for Ugandans. However, I have stationed certain resources in Mugujai (solar power and an old computer which I use for

teaching computer skills). A previous graduate has a vision of creating such a center. It would be legal for him, or any of the new graduates to do it. Also, the RDC has built a new business center in Birijaku. He hopes to open soon. One of the businesses he has planned for the new center is an internet café (or data center). Yes, he has that much interest in the program, it is just government work that has prevented him from attending until now. When he opens, he is going to need staff, and these graduates are among those I am going to recommend to him.
