Worship and Spiritual Life

In addition to preparing for sermons, I also spent time studying and preparing for Episcopal 101, Zimzum Discipleship, and for the spiritual content I teach at our twice-monthly youth group sessions.

The commission discussed and/or supported 7 congregation members with visits, phone contact, cards, prayers, meals, requests for altar flowers after church services, or transportation to church events.

It was decided that at our December meeting, Christmas cards will be addressed to former and current members who have moved away or are unable to attend church. Handmade cards will be provided, and Christmas cookies will be available to eat while addressing cards.

Joys that were celebrated include Brooks, son of Marilyn Zapp, who was baptized Sunday, November 2^{nd} . The labyrinth has been completed for now. Gail Ferguson continues to heal and was able to attend November's meeting.

Progress on special projects by the Pastoral Commission is as follows:

- a. **Tech Skills** Articles were in the Happenings and Glad Tidings asking for volunteers to tutor members with tech skills. Since there was no response, it has been decided that articles will be written for Glad Tidings and The Happenings that inform members of tech help they can get through Computing Seniors that is offered at Kitsap Libraries. Also discussed was the need to keep a resource list of various areas of assistance available in Kitsap County. Copies of the Senior Resources booklet are being requested for the church through Kitsap County Aging & Long Term Care office.
- b. **Grief Books** -Resources are being gathered. Mother Hillary will order the book *Understanding Your Grief* by Alan Wolfelt and pamphlets on grief from Stephen's Ministry to possibly offer to grieving families. Also discussed was a need for St.

Antony to offer a grief group and possibly a Stephen's Ministry group. These two topics will be discussed at future meetings.

c. **Card Making Event**-This is tentatively scheduled for February 7, 2026.

Treasurer, Ex Officio: Jim Foley

Due to some better than normal donations for the month, we were in the black for the month on the operating budget by \$1,070. YTD still looks dismal at \$15,094 in the red, slightly better than the budgeted deficit at this point, and tracking still to the amount over on the mortgage interest, \$16,149 YTD.

The bank accounts are low due to a miscommunication with the Diocese, and their not sending the second withdrawal of \$30k from the Memorial Fund in the DIF.

Progress on the rental house is doing very well, we should be wrapping up this week with the repairs and improvements, and just needing to do a final clean.

I've been informed by Kitsap Bank they are being acquired/merging with Heritage Bank, a larger multi-state bank. If the merger is approved by the powers that be, we will need to update debit cards, etc. sometime next year. This will be the 3rd time since I've been treasurer the banks =have changed or we've changed banks.

I'll start putting together a budget to approve at our December meeting. Input on requests will be welcome.
