

"The Twelve Days of Christmas"

They are the twelve days between Christmas Day and Epiphany on January 6th.

At one time, Christmas presents used to be spaced over these 12 days, which actually seems like quite a good idea, if you can bear to wait. The song was written by a gentleman named Drennon as a "catechism song" to teach young Catholics the tenets of their faith because the law prohibited Catholicism, and adherents would be imprisoned, beheaded or hanged. Each of the gifts given in the song has a hidden meaning.

The PARTRIDGE in a pear tree is Jesus Christ, the Son of God. The two TURTLE DOVES are the old and new testaments, the three FRENCH HENS are Faith, Hope and Charity, the theological virtues. The four CALLING BIRDS are the four Gospels, the five GOLDEN RINGS are the first five books of the Old Testament, the Pentateuch. The six GEESE a-laying are the six days of creation, seven SWANS a-swimming are the seven sacraments, eight MAIDS a-milking are the eight beatitudes, nine LADIES dancing are the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit, ten LORDS a-leaping are the Ten Commandments. The eleven PIPERS piping are the eleven faithful apostles and the twelve DRUMMERS drumming are the twelve points of doctrine in the Apostle's Creed.

When dust settled in Olympia, after the big stampede for grant money, our barn was excluded from funding. We learned that 55 people applied for Heritage Barn Grants and only 34 of those people received money for repairing their barns. Barns that remained in agricultural use gained favor.

So, for us, “it’s back to the drawing board!” In the coming year, we might want to brainstorm for ideas regarding the barn and how we can take care of it.

In fact, the barn is still listed as a Heritage Barn with a significant and rich local history. Though that title comes with no obligation, we might find ways to save the structure. With a little “TLC” it could still become a beautiful part of our landscape. We appreciate your encouragement and support for this project.

Spotlight on Godly Play

This has been an exciting month for Godly Play, our Sunday school program for kids aged 5 - 12 years (4-year-olds eligible based on maturity). Our numbers have increased over the last several weeks, and this Sunday we had a record attendance of 13 students! We are delighted by their curiosity and imagination as we share Bible stories through objects, wondering questions, and fun crafts.

Thanks to outstanding support from the congregation, we have increased our catalog of lessons and are now exploring 'new' stories with our students, such as those of Old Testament heroes like Esther and Daniel and modern-day saints like St. Teresa of Calcutta and Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. We were also generously gifted photographic tapestries depicting real Holy Land sites, bringing to life the adventures and challenges the children learn about.

Sadly, our biggest change in December was saying farewell to one of our Godly Play teachers, Geri Sanchez and her son, Ritchie. They have been a blessing to our church through just about every ministry at St. Antony's. We will miss them greatly and wish them the best.

This means, however, we now only have 2 teachers for Godly Play. Each week, the class must be staffed with 2 adults in accordance with Safe Church guidelines. The teacher or "storyteller" follows a simple script using illustrative props, and the "shepherd" helps focus students' attention and participation.

We are urgently seeking at least 2 more adults who can commit at least 1 Sunday per month to act as Shepherd and/or Storyteller, enabling all our adults to experience sanctuary worship from time to time. We have written curriculum guides and online videos of the lessons (lasting no more than 15 minutes). Storytelling needs only about 1-2 hours of study, and Shepherding is basically monitoring behavior, setting up snacks, and sometimes facilitating crafts (no preparation required).

Please keep this program and our children in your prayers. It is a wonderful thing to see them understand how God works in their lives everyday and a blessing to be part of their faith journey. 
