Vicar's Voice

One of the features of June in the Pacific Northwest is the phenomenon we sometimes call June-uary or June Gloom. We know them as the days that turn gray, chilly, and rainy, bringing us back into winter just when we've gotten used to enjoying the bright and warm days of summer. This year, June is also bringing us Trinity Sunday followed by the shift back into Ordinary Time. With that liturgical shift, our altar will soon return to green, the color of learning and growth, as our weekly scripture readings take us through various stories of God's people through the ages. With few major feast days on the church calendar for the next few months, sometimes ordinary time can feel like the June Gloom of the liturgical year. There are bright moments, and there are quiet moments.

The metaphor is somewhat apt! Sure, some church programs will take a break or slow down during summer, but other programs like Vacation Bible School and new ones like Summer Evening Prayer will gear up. This summer time shift in the calendar year, the church year, and the weather, together, all remind me to pay attention to and appreciate the sacred ordinary moments unfolding all around us. Summer may be dotted with big events and holidays or special occasions, but in between those moments of brightness are the quieter moments, the peaceful deep breaths, the rainy and cool days with their own kind of beauty.

What are the sacred ordinary moments in your life? How can you intentionally seek to notice the Holy Spirit moving in those moments? And how might God be calling you to join in that work?

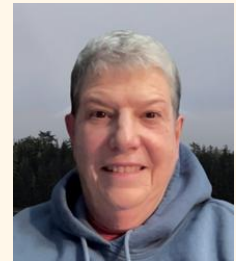
