## *Vicar's Voice*

Autumn is nearly upon us! The autumnal equinox will be September 22 this year, but you wouldn't know that based on all the displays in the stores, which are already selling Halloween items-- that is, if they haven't already moved on to Christmas! I have jokingly called this shopping phenomenon the "Merry Hallowthankmas!"

The crazy fast pace that our capitalistic society wants to drag us into exhausting at times! I have found myself feeling especially worn out by it this year after a very busy summer with almost no time off. (I hope to rectify that before Advent is upon us.) Every day, there are things on the to-do list that don't get finished so they are moved onto the next day's list. Every season we are in, we are already looking ahead to the next. Our Bishop's office contacted me this week to check on a date for a bishop's staff member to visit NEXT November! My mind was blown.

It gets overwhelming--how hard it feels at times to simply be in the moment sometimes! If you combine the harried busy-ness of life with the anxiety that comes from watching the news and wondering what will happen to our nation or the earth we call home, you get a terrible combination of frantic, exhausted, fretting!

And yet, as Christians, one of the benefits of our faith is "that peace that passes all A understanding." At Christmas (which must be around the corner according to World Market!), we call Jesus the Prince of Peace. As he teaches us in the gospels, "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?... Your heavenly Father knows that you need these things, but seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own."

This week, our Zimzum Discipleship small group met and explored the idea of "practicing paradise"-- and I found that was exactly the cure to my struggle! In my imagining of paradise, there is no hurry or rush, no pressure or deadlines, no need to be striving toward anything but being fully present in the moment. So I offer that to you this fall, while the world tries to rush you into Christmas before summer has even ended-- practice paradise! Be present in the moment. Breathe. Lay in the sun. Appreciate the little things in life. Celebrate the joys.

And love one another. Love, love, love each other. Every good thing is worth doing, no matter how small. And so, go in peace to love and serve the Lord. Thanks be to God.

## *Musings from the Bishop's Warden*

### What I Did in Vacation Bible School as a Volunteer

At the end of July, St. Antony hosted Vacation Bible School with the theme of Emerald Crossing and the study of Psalm 23. Besides being amazed by the creativity and dedications of the other volunteers, both adults and teens, I didn't expect Vacation Bible School to teach me as much as it taught the children, but from the very first morning, I found myself learning in ways I hadn't anticipated. From the morning and closing gatherings to the games I helped facilitate, I saw both excitement and wonder. It wasn't just about learning Bible stories; it was about practicing and living them.

One thing though, will stay with me forever. A young child, missing one leg, was eager to join the physical games and would often come early and want to help. She didn't ask for special treatment, and her group didn't offer any — only encouragement. They cheered her through every challenge and celebrated her efforts. She moved with quiet determination, and they surrounded her with love.

Watching her, I realized that courage doesn't always look dramatic. Sometimes it simply shows up, tries, and trusts that others will stand beside you. And watching the other children, I saw compassion in its purest form, the kind of love that lifts someone up without making them feel different.

In that moment, I understood something deeper about faith. We often talk about God's love as something we learn, something we study, something we try to practice. But these children weren't trying — they were simply doing. Their kindness wasn't taught; it was lived. Their compassion wasn't instructed; it was instinctive. And their support for one another reflected the very heart of the lessons we hoped to teach.

I came to VBS expecting to guide children through stories of faith. Instead, they showed me what faith looks like in action — eager hearts, open hands, and a community where everyone belongs. They reminded me that compassion is not a grand gesture but a daily choice, and that sometimes the greatest lessons come from the smallest voices.

And I left with a renewed understanding: faith grows strongest when it is shared, and compassion becomes real when it is practiced. Those children didn't just learn about God's love — they showed it to me.

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This year's Vacation Bible School (VBS) was led by Holly Folley and Jane Stockton. Here is what they had to say:

### **Emerald Crossing VBS — What a Wonderful Week of VBS!**

What a wonderful week we shared at **Emerald Crossing Vacation Bible School** back in July! This year, **17 children** joined us for five mornings of faith, friendship, music, crafts, games, Bible learning, and plenty of delicious snacks. An incredible team of nearly 40 volunteers supported them, including station leaders, crew leaders, junior crew members, kitchen helpers, first-aid support, decorators, planners, and many others who gave their time and talents before and during VBS. We are grateful for everyone who helped create a welcoming, joyful place for our children to learn and grow.

Throughout the week, our Emerald Crossing flock journeyed through **Psalm 23**, learning about the Good Shepherd as we sang, created, played, and served together. Thank you to everyone who donated supplies, prayed for VBS, volunteered, brought children, helped with setup and cleanup, or encouraged us along the way. 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### **Contemplative Prayer**

Also available is our Contemplative Prayer group that meets on the second and fourth Tuesday of the month at noon in the chapel. Loretta McGinley is the point of contact for this lovely small group of individuals looking for quiet, inner-focused faith exploration. Loretta said the group “met twice in August, and changed our regular second meeting date to accommodate for VBS. We continue to meet the second and fourth Tuesdays each month from 12:00-1:00, and welcome anyone interested in time for quiet reflection and prayer guided by Christian contemplative practices.”

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### **Episcopal 101**

They spent three sessions studying Baptism, the Eucharist and other sacraments like marriage and ordination.

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### **ZimZum**

Bishop Phil talked this month about creation care for his living a Christ-Centered Life through ZimZum Discipleship. You can find the video here: <https://ecww.org/zimzum-discipleship-lesson-3-creation-justice/>.

To summarize, he speaks about our role as stewards of Earth: “We know that we’re in the midst of an environmental crisis. However, Brian McLaren reminds us that maybe we shouldn’t call it an environmental crisis, focusing on the victim of it, but rather calling it what it is, which is an overconsumption crisis. McLaren suggests that in the background,

our framing story is one of acquiring things, and so in his book, *Everything Must Change*, he says that we need to think about what that framing story is. He writes, ‘If that framing story tells us that the purpose of a life is for individuals or nations to accumulate an abundance of possessions, and to experience the maximum amount of pleasure during the maximum number of minutes of our short lives, then we will have little reason to manage our consumption.’”

ZimZum discipleship meets once a month and is facilitated by Mother Hillary. There is always “room for more” and all are welcome. 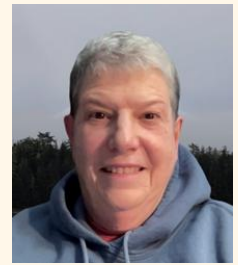

### Prison Ministry

In my last newsletter I answered the question, ‘How is the prison ministry being received?’ I would like to provide three updates.

1. The prison ministry team in Koboko decided to hold ‘tea party’ this year to tell more people about the ministry and invite them to join. A tea party is like afternoon tea except it is not as formal and the food that accompanies the tea can be anything. Our tea party program was centered around our calling to offer the full program of Kairos; our next step being offering a Kairos weekend. We shared that this will be the first Kairos weekend in Uganda – anywhere in Uganda. We talked about it in terms of discipleship and the change we have been seeing and hope to see more of so the prisoners can be good members of their communities and not return to prison (as prisoners) after being released. We did not talk about it as a fourth day ministry because Cursillo, Episcopal Cursillo, Walk to Emmaus, A4D, Via de Cristo, etc. are not present and therefore unknown in Uganda. While attendance was lower than response told us to expect, the message was well received and several expressed interest in joining us. We even had the new prison chaplain and the Deputy Officer-in-Charge in attendance, and they gave testimony that the ministry is well received.
2. The Kairos manual documents that frequently there are problems as preparations are made for a Kairos weekend. It talks about them in terms as the devil not wanting things to go well. They could be signs that we are doing the Lord’s work. We should check, and if we are, we should love those problems and continue in the Lord’s work.

When we went to Koboko prison for our weekly ministry the Deputy Officer-in-Charge pulled us aside and told us about a female prisoner that was possessed and asked us to pray for her deliverance following our normal sharing of the gospel. She understood the obstacles that normally stand in our way, only the female members of the team are allowed the female side of the prison unless escorted, and we would need permission to extend beyond the normal time limit. She cleared both obstacles for us.

Following my sharing on the men’s side, she escorted me to the women’s side – personally. The sharing on the women’s side finished shortly after we arrived. Then we began praying over the possessed woman. Both of my teammates (one male, one female) and the Deputy Officer-in-Charge physically touched the possessed. As for me, I had memory of Acts 19, specifically verse 15, so I was praying fervently that Jesus would be present and act through **all** of us.

The process took time and once we thought it was done, but she did not respond favorably. No one stopped praying, we were determined and...she was set free. Afterwards she talked about what she was supposed to do, and did not want to do, but failed to resist.

She was grateful!

So are the other female prisoners and the prison officers.

3. We met with the deacon in charge of six churches (Mission stations) for the Church of Uganda in Lobule sub-county. He is grateful that we are coming across the district (for those in the US think state – a Ugandan district is the governmental unit below national government) for prison ministry at Lobule. Rev. Wilfred said, “It’s a real ministry”. He said it is hard, covering so many churches. However, he did manage to visit the prison while we were there for ministry so the team could introduce him.

We hope that this is the beginning of local support for prison ministry on that side of the district. It is favorably received; people are just hesitant to begin. We desire to help them through that process by inviting them to join us instead of trying to do it on their own. If they want to do their own denominational ministry later; I pray it happens at God’s direction. We (the entire prison ministry team) are convinced that inviting more people to share in the ministry is God’s direction to us as we seek to grow the ministry in preparation for offering a Kairos weekend.
